Upon motion duly made and carried it was ordered that the proposed franchise together with the letter of transmittal sent by the committee to the Council be printed in the next issue of the Milwaukie Review.

O. F. Witte, was present and applied for a license to sell non-intoxicating beverages on the premises known as Crystal Lake Park and also applied for a dance hall license. Upon motion duly made and carried it was ordered that Mr. Witte's application be approved and that a license to sell non-intoxicating beverages and a dance hall license be issued to him upon his paying the proper license fees.

The three hundred seventy-fourth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 8th day of May, 1933 in the Council Chambers at the City Hall. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Miller Present Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dean, Dell, Shrock and Walsh; Marshal Keck and Recorder Adams. Absent Councilman Sanders.

The minutes of the three hundred seventy-third regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie and the minutes of the special meetings held on the 11th, 17th, 18th and 25th days of April, 1933 respectively were each read and were each approved as read.

Upon motion duly made and carried it was ordered that the recorder issue warrants each month in payment of the contributions due the State Industrial Accident Commission on account of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation's work within the Town of Milwaukie.

The Recorder reported that he had interviewed Mrs. Hilda Carlson and that she had stated that she would take care of the repair of the sidewalk in front of her premises as soon as her husband returned. Upon motion duly made and carried it was ordered that the Street Superintendent utilize some of the workers made available by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation in repairing the sidewalk.

Upon motion duly made and carried the Recorder was instructed to prepare and post an ordinance providing for the position of a relief agent to act under the supervision of the Council.

Upon motion duly made and carried it was ordered that the Fire Chief clean and maintain the City's fire hydrants and that two of the workers made available by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation be assigned to assist him.

Council Chambers

The three hundred seventy-fifth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 12th day of June, 1933, in the Council Chambers at the City Hall. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Miller. Present Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dean, Dell, Shrock and Walsh, Marshal Keck and Recorder Adams. Absent Councilman Sanders.

The minutes of the three hundred seventy-fourth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie were read and were approved as read.

A letter from Charles M. Thomas, Public Utilities Commissioner of Oregon, was read in which Mr. Thomas stated that he approved Ordinance Number 325 granting a franchise to the Portland General Electric Company except that he thought it would be inadvisable to adopt the ordinance unless a provision was put therein whereby the Town of Milwaukie could revoke the franchise upon notice to the company.

A letter signed by Joseph Maurer and C. W. Rudder, minority members of the citizen's franchise committee was also read in which the two minority members urged that the franchise ordinance be rejected unless a revocation clause was inserted therein.

The recorder advised that it would be advisable to insert in the franchise a revocation clause inasmuch as the Town of Milwaukie would then have the power to revoke the franchise, which power would be a highly desirable thing in the event of a public development of electric power.

The majority members of the Citizen's Franchise Committee consisting of E. B. Stanley, S. S. Fields, S. G. Coates, W. E. Kelso, J. N. Devee, W. H. Grastle and Sam Riley recommended that the franchise be adopted.

Ordinance Number 325 entitled "An ordinance granting to the Portland General Electric Company, an Oregon Corporation, its successors and assigns the right, privilege and franchise to erect, construct and maintain an electric transmission
