TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JULY 29TH. 1929.

An adjourned meeting of the three hundred twenty-eight regular meeting of the Council was held on the 29th. day of July, 1929. Meeting called to order by Councilman Shindler, President of the Council, Present, Councilmen, Shindler, Sanders, Deans and Dell; Recorder Mathews and meeting Marshal Keckler of Milwaukie was held on the 29th. day of July, 1929.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the bids for the improvement of Jefferson Street were opened and read, which bids were as follows:

C. H. Counsell..	\$1303.20.
George Abraham..	1517.00.
J. W. Schuld and M. E. Gaffney.	1394.00.

C. H. Counsell having submitted the lowest bid for the improvement of Jefferson Street, upon motion duly made and carried, C. H. Counsell was awarded the contract for the improvement of Jefferson Street for the sum of \$1303.20 his proposal therefor. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into a contract on behalf of Milwaukie with C. H. Counsell for the improvement of Jefferson Street.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 293 entitled, "An Ordinance establishing the grades of Jefferson Street from the East side of 37th. Street east to the City limits, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 293 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 293 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 293 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 293 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 294 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. There being no remonstrances or objections made or filed to the proposed improvement of Willard Street, upon motion duly made and carried,

Ordinance No. 295 entitled, "An ordinance providing for the improvement of Willard Street in Milwaukie, Oregon, from the west line of Lot 3, Block 3, Young's Addition to Milwaukie, easterly to the west line of 27th. Street, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The Ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 295 passed the first reading, Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 295 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 295 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 295 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the improvement of Willard Street, the bids to be opened by the Council on the 12th. day of August, 1929.

The City Engineer having filed a certificate of the completion of the improvement of 35th. Street, and his approval of such work with the Recorder, upon motion duly made and carried, the 12th. day of August, 1929, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M. of said day was the time set for considering the acceptance of said improvement by the Council.

A communication from F. A. Deputy asking the Council to pay for the water used through his meter by the County in the improvement of 40th. Street, was read and referred to the Water Committee. Upon motion duly made and carried, the request of School Dist. No. 1, that Milwaukie furnish it with sufficient water to soften the dirt around the School house was granted. Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the proposition of School District No. 1, to give the City of Milwaukie a tract of land on Monroe Street 90 feet by 70 feet and \$300.00 for the two lots where the city hall is now located was accepted and the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to execute a deed on behalf of Milwaukie conveying said lots to School District No. 1, to be delivered to the School District upon the payment of \$300.00 and the delivery of a deed conveying to the City a tract of land 90 feet by 70 feet on Monroe Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the matter of preparing the foundation and selecting the location to move the City Hall was left to the Street Committee with full power to act. Upon motion duly made and carried, G. C. Pelton was employed to move the city hall to the new location at a price not to exceed the sum of \$300.00.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
