

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUGUST 26TH. 1925.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred eighty-first regular meeting of the Council was held on the 26th. day of August, 1925.

Mayor Cowell being absent, C. Kerr president of the Council called the meeting to order. Present., Councilmen Kerr, Ramsey, McIntyre and Hazen, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. There being no objections made or filed to the acceptance of the improvement of 32nd. Street, upon motion duly made and carried, the improvement of 32nd. Street was accepted, and the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the 32nd. Street Improvement Fund in favor of Peterson & Scott for the balance due for the improvement of said street, except the sum of \$25.00. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Engineering was instructed to prepare the assessment roll for the improvement of 32nd. Street. Mr. Kelly and Mr. Richmond of the Portland Electric Power Company was present and stated that they did not know yet whether the Company would take up its spur track on Jackson Street or take up part of it and leave a spur track of about 100 feet. If the Company decided to leave part of the track it would pay its portion of paving the same. They agreed to let the Council know of the decision of the Company immediately.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 230 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-called the showed the following result: Ayes, Councilmen Ramsey, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 230 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 230 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Councilmen Ramsey, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 230 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 230 was taken up for the third and final read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Councilmen Ramsey, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 230 passed the third and final reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed advertise for bids for the improvement of East Monroe Street; the bids to be opened on the 8th. day of September, 1925. A petition of owner^s of real property abutting on Lake Road for the improvement of Lake Road was read, and the Council deeming it necessary to improve said street as petitioned for, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepar plans and specifications for the improvement thereof as petitioned for. There being no objections made against the improvement of 28th. Street, upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance providing for the improvement of 28th. Street and post the same as required by the City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that if there was any money left out of the \$35,000.00 bond issue after paving the streets already ordered paved, that west Monroe Street be paved. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, SEPT. 8TH. 1925.

The two hundred eighty-second regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 8th. day of September, 1925.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Ramsey, Kerr, Kelso, McIntyre and Hazen, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred eighty-first regular meeting of the Council held on the 11th day of August, 1925, and the minutes of the adjourned meetings of the two hundred eighty-regular meeting of the council held on the 14th and 26th days of August, 1925, respectively, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Finance Committee was instructed to notify the Treasurer to transfer \$5500.00 from the Street Paving fund to the Water fund in payment of the amount owing the Water fund.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to notify Mrs. Nettie Olsen that if she would improve 27th. Street from the present improvement southerly to Lake Road by gravelling and putting the same in condition for paving this winter that the Council would pave the same next summer to a width of 16 feet.

The bid of Peterson & Scott of \$992.00 for the improvement of East Monroe Street was opened and read and upon motion duly made and carried, the bid was rejected and their certified check ordered returned to them. No satisfactory bid having been received for the improvement of East Monroe Street, upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the Council proceed to make the improvement as petitioned for, and the City Engineer was instructed to supervise the work. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the Portland Electric Power Company that the Town of Milwaukie desired a spur track in Jackson Street

of not less than 100 feet. The application of J. A. Keck for a ten days paid vacation was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the application was granted. A petition requesting the Council to purchase the Marshal a motor vehicle for his use at a cost not exceeding \$350.00 was read and taken under advisement until the next meeting of the Council. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 231 entitled, "An ordinance providing for the issuance of licenses to breeder's of dogs within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon; providing amount of license fee and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results. Ayes, Councilmen Kerr and Hazen. Nays, Councilmen Ramsey, Kelso and McIntyre. Ordinance No. 231 failed to pass the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that ordinance No. 231 be amended so as to provide that before a license could be issued, that the application must secure the written consent of three fourths of the resident property owners residing within a radius of 200 feet of where the dogs were proposed to be kept. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Supt. was instructed to cut all grass, thistles and obnoxious weeds in the streets of the Town of Milwaukie, and render a bill to the property owners for the cost of the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to establish sidewalk grades on Jackson Street between 40th and 42nd. Streets. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the Council petition the County Court of Clackamas County requesting the County to put in a foot bridge across Johnson Creek.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred eighty-second regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 15th. day of September, 1925. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Ramsey, Kerr, McIntyre and Hazen, and Recorder Mathews. The resignation of W. E. Kelso as councilman from Ward No. 2, was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the resignation of W. E. Kelso as Councilman from Ward No. 2 was accepted.

W. H. Grasle and M. J. Walsh were nominated as Councilman in Ward No. 2 to fill the unexpired term of W. E. Kelso, resigned. M. J. Walsh withdrew his name as a nominee for councilman in Ward No. 2. Upon motion duly made and carried, W. H. Grasle was elected Councilman in and for Ward No. 2, to fill the unexpired term of W. E. Kelso, and was duly sworn in as such councilman. The City Engineer having filed with the Recorder plans and specifications for the improvement of Lake Road, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council, the following resolution and notice was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was adopted as read:
