The Street Commissioner was instructed to cut out enough of the floor in the back part of the City Hall in order that the roller can be run in out of the rain. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into a contract, on behalf of the Town, with the City of Portland for securing water for Milwaukie for a period of two years. The Recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Ringler to secure the services of some one, to be approved by the Council, and at his own expense, to maintain order at his dancing pavillion in Milwaukie, Oregon, when the same is in use. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
