Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Grasle, Bates and Seavey, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. There being no objections to the proposed assessment for the improvement of 27th. Street, upon motion of councilman Grasle seconded by councilman Bates and carried, Ordinance No. 157 entitled, " An ordinance declaring the assessment for the improvement of 27th. Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from the south line of Washington Street-to a point about 1000 feet south of the south line of Washington Street, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following results. Ayes, Grasle, Bates and Seavey. Nays. None. Absent, Shindler and Miller. Ordinance Noorlowpassed the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Pates seconded by councilman Grasle and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 157 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Grasle, Rates and Seavey. Nays, None. Absent, Shindler and Miller. Ordinance No. 157 passed the second reading. Town Hall Milwaukie, Oregon, Oct. 2nd. 1917.

The one hundred eighty-seventh regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on Oct. 2nd 1917. Meeting called to order by mayor Snyder. Present; Councilmen Shindler, Grasle, Miller, Pates and Seavey, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the tome hand fed hundred eighty-sixth regular meeting of the Council held on the 4th day of September, 1917, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 13th day of September, and of the adjourned meeting of the one hundred eighty-sixth regular meeting held on the 25th day of September were read and approved as read. Councilman Bates reported that he had looked over the road near Mr. warvey's place and found it in bad condition and would recommende that it be fixed with gravel. Upon motion duly made and carried, \$150.00 was appropriated for gravelling and rolling the Harvey Road in front of Mr. Harvey's and vicinity. Upon motion duly made and carried, the matter of accepting the Foster Road improvement was referred to the Street Committee . Councilman Bates presented a form of a daily report for the Street and Water Commissioner and recommended that the Council have 1000 forms printed. Upon motion duly made and carried, Councilman Pates was authorized to have 1000 report froms for the Street and Water Commissioner printed and to purchase a loose leaf book to hold the said reports. The report of the Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. The matter of cutting the grass, cleaning the sidewalks and cutting the limbs from the trees overhanging the sidewalks was left with the Street Commissioner. The Recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Gibson to repair the water main between Railroad Avenue and Mr. Campbell place on marrison Street within ten days. A petition of the property owners along 24th Street requesting the Council to smooth up and gravel said Street was read, but no action was taken in regard to the same. The recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Passett to repair and keep

gum in his gum machine or remove the same.
