

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MARCH 6TH. 1917.

The one hundred eightieth (180) regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Shindler, Grasle, Miller, Rates and Seavey, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the one hundred seventy-ninth regular meeting held on the 6th day of February, 1917, were read and approved as read. A petition of property owners whose property abuts on 31st Street requesting the Council to improve the same was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the petition was allowed and the Council deeming it necessary to improve said street, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of said street and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof. The petition of the School District requesting the Council to have the grade stakes set on the east and west side of the School house as it desired to construct cement side walks was read and upon motion duly made and carried the petition was granted and the City Engineering instructed to set said grade stakes. The bid of John H. Gibson of \$50.00 for the old water tank and tower was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the bid was accepted, provided Mr. Gibson assume all damage while the Tank and Tower remained at its present location. The petition of Mr. Seavey of the Clean Up Day Committee requesting the Council to appropriate \$15.00 to buy provisions and flower seeds, and to denote the use of five teams, the axes and shovels belonging to the Town and use of the City Hall was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was allowed. The Committee to whom the matter of investigating feasibility of establishing a Carnegie Library reported that they were not in favor of the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, D. W. Taylor was employed by the Town as Engineer for the purpose of improving 31st Street and setting the grade stakes as requested by the School District.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to prepare ~~###~~ a bill of sale of the old water tank & Tower conveying the same to John H. Gibson, and that the Mayor and Recorder execute the same in behalf of the Town. Ordinance No. 148 was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to post a copy of the same as required by the City Charter. Ordinance No. 149 was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to post a copy of the same as required by the Town Charter. Mr Carver was present and requested the Council to pass an ordinance granting him anew Franchise, but the matter was postponed until the 21st day of March, 1917.
