

MEETING OF JUNE 22, 1950

A special meeting of the Planning Commission was held on the 22nd day of June, 1950 for the purpose of considering a petition of appeal, remonstrating the building of a church on what is known as the Olson Tract at the southwest corner of 27th and Willard Streets.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Jones.

Present: Jones, Nickles, Egge, Swaggerty, Stewart, Martin, Williams, Kirkpatrick and Sperr.

The petition of appeal requesting that the permit for the construction of a church on property at the southwest corner of 27th and Willard Streets was discussed and considered. It appeared that the protestants felt that they had not been given sufficient notice of the former meetings at which this matter was the order of business. The signers of the petition stated they weren't objecting to the church as a church but wanted the property left for residential purposes only. In as much as Public Notice had been published in the Milwaukee Review, the Commission felt that all requirements had been complied with.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Martin that the Commission deny the appeal prayed for in the petition. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mayor Fred Sperr did not vote on the question, having been excused by his own request.

The following committee was appointed to make investigation of the operation of plywood plants in Milwaukee in order to ascertain if or not they were going beyond their permit limitations. Committee:--Nickles, Swaggerty, Stewart, Martin and Williams.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
