TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUGUST 8TH. 1932.

The three hundred sixtyfifth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 8th. day of August, 1932. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Bevington and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred sixty-fourth regular meeting of the Council held on the 11th. day of July, 1932, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, the proposition of Parker-Schram Company to resurface Lake Road and a portion of Harrison Street with Asphaltic concrete pavement instead of Bitumuls pavement as per their proposal was granted and the City Engineer was instructed to change the specifications accordingly. Upon motion duly made and carried, Foster-Kleiser Company, were allowed to use Lots 7 & 8 in Block 28, for advertising purposes for \$25.00 per year, until such a time as the City sells said property or until the City needs the property for other purposes.

A petition requesting the Council to pave the fill between 27th. & 28th. Streets on Monroe Streets was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the petition was laid on the table, and the Engineer was requested to furnish the Council with an estimate of the cost of the pavement requested.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Supt. was instructed to take off the edges of the pavement on Lake Road as requested by the City Engineer. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 314 granting the Portland General Electric Company a 20 years franchise was taken up for the first read. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 314 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. M. as the time and the City Hall as the place for hearing objections to the acceptance of such improvement. The application of J. F. Elliott for a weeks vacation was granted by the Council.
