TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, NOV. 12TH. 1926.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred ninety-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 12th. day of November, 1926. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Ramsey, Kerr, Grasse and Frey, and Recorder Mathews. There being no objections made to the proposed budget for the year 1927, the following resolution was read and unanimously adopted as Read:

14-1926 RE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE that a special tax of \$14,509.00 be and hereby is levied against the taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, for Town purposes for the year 1927. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the P. E. P. Co. to repair the sidewalks on Monroe and Front Streets where the Company has removed its power and light poles. It appearing that sufficient number of property owners have signed the petition for the construction of a sewer on East Harrison Street and other streets north thereof, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the construction of said sewer and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof. The engineer having filed plans and specifications for the construction of said sewer and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and said plans, specifications being satisfactory to the Council the following resolution was read and unanimously adopted as read:

RESOLUTION FOR SEWER WORK.

15-1926 WHEREAS, heretofore there has been filed with the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, a certain petition signed by the resident owners of more than one-fourth the area of the real property in a certain district, as hereinafter described, within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, praying for the making of certain improvements by the laying of sewers, and, Whereas, the Council of the Town of Milwaukie deems it expedient and necessary to grant said petition and make the improvement hereinafter described in the manner set forth, and has required from the City Engineer plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement, and an estimate of the total cost of the work to be done, and,

Whereas, the City Engineer has heretofore filed said plans and specifications, and estimates in the office of the Recorder, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the aforesaid plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer now on file with the Recorder are found to be satisfactory, and are hereby approved, and, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council does declare its intention of making said improvement, the location and kind of said improvement being as follows:

By the construction of certain sewers along the lines hereinafter stated, which said sewers shall include all catch basin inlets, and all other things necessary in the construction of said sewers, all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file with the City Recorder, which said plans and specifications are hereby referred to and made a part of this resolution.

Said sewers are to be constructed along the following lines, and the termini and routes thereof are as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of 29th. and Harrison Streets and extending easterly along Harrison Street 3554 feet; Beginning at the intersection of 30th. and Harrison Streets, and extending northerly and northwesterly along 30th. street 695 feet; Beginning at the intersection of 31st. and Harrison Streets and extending northerly along 31st. Street 595 feet. Beginning at the intersection of 32nd and Harrison Streets and extending northerly along 32nd Street 650.3 feet. Beginning at the intersection of 32nd and Llewellyn Streets and extending easterly 417.1 feet. Beginning at the intersection of 34th. and Harrison Streets and extending northerly 470.5 feet. Beginning at the intersection of 37th and Harrison Streets, and extending northerly 320.0 feet. Beginning at the intersection of 40th and Harrison Streets, and extending northerly 255 feet; beginning at the intersection of 40th and Llewellyn Streets, and extending easterly 570 feet.

The City Engineer's estimate of the probable cost of said improvement is Fifteen Thousand three hundred sixty-two (\$15362.00).

The district liable to be assessed for the aforesaid improvement is as follows: Beginning at the southwesterly corner of Lot 11, Block 2 Brownell Acres; thence northerly to the northwesterly corner of Lot 11, Block 2 Brownell Acres; thence easterly to the northeasterly corner of Lot 11, Block 2 Brownell Acres; thence northerly along the north and south center line of Block 2 Brownell Acres and its projection northerly to the northeasterly side of Block 2 Brownell Acres; thence northwesterly along the northeasterly side of Block 2 Brownell Acres to the northeasterly corner of Lot 1, Block 2 Brownell Acres; thence northeasterly to the northwesterly corner of Lot 1, Block 3 Brownell Acres; thence easterly to the northeasterly corner of Lot 1 Block 3 Brownell Acres; thence southeasterly to the northwesterly corner of Block 3 Gallop; thence easterly to the northeasterly corner of Lot 3, Block 2, Leo; thence southerly to the southeasterly corner of Lot 3, Block 2, Leo; thence easterly to the southwesterly corner of Lot 13, Block 2, Leo; thence easterly ~~to the southwesterly corner of~~ along the northerly side of Lot 13, Block 2, Leo, and the easterly projection thereof to a point that is 140 feet easterly from the easterly side of Block 2, Leo; thence south to the northerly side of Lot 1, Block 2 Leo First Addition; thence easterly to the northeasterly corner of Lot 9, Block 2 Leo First Addition; thence southeasterly to the southeasterly corner of the intersection of 34th and King Streets; thence easterly along the southerly property line of King Street to the southwesterly corner of the intersection of 37th. and King Streets; thence southerly along the westerly side of 37th. Street to a point that is in the westerly projection of the east and west center line of Block 14, Minthorn Addition; thence easterly to the northeasterly corner of Lot 29, Block 14, Minthorn Addition; thence southerly to the southeasterly corner of Lot 20, Block 15 Minthorn Addition; thence easterly to the southwesterly corner of Lot 4, Block 15, Minthorn Addition; thence northerly to the northwesterly corner of Lot 45, Block 15, Minthorn Addition; thence easterly to the northeasterly corner of Lot 48, Block 13 Minthorn Addition; thence southerly to the southeasterly corner of Lot 1, Block 41 Minthorn Addition; thence westerly to the southwesterly corner of Lot 23, Block 42 Minthorn Addn; thence northwesterly to a point in the westerly side of 37th. Street that is 100 feet southerly from the southerly side of Harrison Street; thence westerly parallel to the southerly side of Harrison Street and 100 feet southerly to a point in the easterly side of Tract 2 Karlens 2nd. Addn.; thence northerly to the northeasterly corner of Tract 2 Karlens 2nd. Addn; thence northeasterly to the place of beginning.

That the above described district is the district referred to in Paragraph One (1) of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Marshal shall within five (5) days from the date hereof, give notice of the passage of this resolution by posting three (3) notices headed "Notice of Sewer Work" on the streets along the line of the contemplated sewer, which notice shall contain a copy of this resolution and shall set the time within which remonstrance against said improvement may be filed.

RE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that objections and remonstrances may be filed with the Recorder against the aforesaid improvement at any time within ten (10) days after the date of posting of said notices by the City Marshal and the same will be heard and considered by the Council at a special meeting of said Council to be held on the 30th. day of November, 1926, at 7:30 P. M.

Whereas, it is necessary that the said improvement be made at as early a date as possible, as said sewer is urgently needed, and it is necessary to take advantage of weather conditions in the construction thereof; Now Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this resolution shall go into force and effect immediately upon its adoption approval. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the P. E. P. Company to install a street lamp at 38th. Street and Harvey Avenue when poles are in place. The following persons were appointed Judges and Clerks of the election to be held on the 6th. day of December, 1926, to-wit: Ward No. 1. Judges: Anna B. Adams, H. W. Hoesly and Ida E. Meaney; Clerks: Bernice Bates and Sadie Llewellyn. Ward No. 2. Judges: N. B. Harvey, Will Sanders and James A. Rigdon; Clerks: De Etta Kelso and Jennie Sanders;

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned until the 30th. day of November, 1926.
