An adjourned meeting of the two hundred fifty third regular meeting of the Council was held on the 26th day of April, 1923. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, councilmen, Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Riley, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. Upon motion duly made and carried, the bids for the improvement of 31st. H. W. Oliver having submitted the lowest bid for the improvement of 31st. Street, was awarded the contract for the improvement of said street and the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into a contract on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie with H. W. Oliver for the improvement of 31st. Street.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the bids for the improvement of Harrison Street were opened and read, which bids were as follows: C. H. Counsell..... \$3731.00

H. W. Oliver having submitted the lowest bid for the improvement of Harrison Street was awarded the contract for the improvement of said street, and the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into a contract on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie with H. W. Oliver for the improvement of Harrison Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Oliver was required to furnish a bond of 75% of the amount of each bid. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to return the checks accompanying their bids to the unsuccessful bidders. Upon motion duly made and carried, councilman Kerr was instructed to remove the elevated platform and steps from the west side of the old Car Barn as they are obstructing the street, and also to remove the obstructions from the street on the south side of the old Car Barn. The City Engineer having filed his acceptance of the improvement of Myrtle with his approval of said work with the Recorder, upon motion duly made and carried, the 8th day of May, 1923, at the hour of 8:00 P. M. of said day was the time fixed for considering said acceptance of the completion of Myrtle Street. Moved and seconded that the report of the Public accountant on the audit of the City books be put over until the next regular meeting. Motion withdrawn. The report of the audit of the City Books was read. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 192 was taken up for the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the improvement of 29th. Street, in the Daily-Record Abstract, said bids to be opened on the 8th day of May, 1923, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M. of said day.

Mr. I. J. Homaday and other residents on the Glover Road were present and asked the City of Milwaukie take over the reading of 10 meters and collection of water bills, and asked that the minimum rate of \$1.50 per month for 300 cubic feet be charged. Mr. Glover was also present and made application to the Council to have the City of Milwaukie furnish him with bull run water. Upon motion duly made and carried, both matters were referred to the Water Committee. The following Bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the City Treasury in payment of the same:

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 8TH. 1923.

The two hundred fifty-fourth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 8th day of May, 1923. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, councilmen, Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Riley, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred fifty-third regular meeting of the Council held on the 10th day of April, 1923, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the two hundred fifty-third regular meeting held on the 26th day of April, 1923, were read and approved as read. Moved and carried, that the bids for the improvement of 29th Street be opened. Mayor Cowell stated, that before the bids were opened, that he wanted to advise the Council that if the Council awarded the contract for the improvement of 29th Street, under the present plans and specifications, he would refuse to sign the contract as he had legal advise to the effect that if the street was improved under the present plans and specifications that the railroad Company could not be compelled to pay its portion of the cost of the improvement, and that the Town would have to pay it.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council rejected all the bids for the improvement of 29th Street, and the Recorder was instructed to return to same to the bidders. There being no objections made or filed to the acceptance of the improvement of Myrtle Street, upon motion duly made and carried, the completion of Myrtle Street was accepted.

The proposed assessment for the improvement of Myrtle Street was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the 12th day of June, 1923, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M. of said day was the time and the City Hall, the place fixed and appointed for considering said proposed assessment and hearing objections thereto, if any. The report of the Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file when the same was signed by the Treasurer. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to interview the County Court and ascertain how soon the County could patch the pavement in Milwaukie.

Moved by councilman Riley and seconded by councilman McIntyre that the Treasurer be compelled to reimburse the Town for the money lost by the Town by his failure to taken up and retire improvement bonds when there were sufficient funds on hand to do so. Motion withdrawn.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Treasurer was instructed to be on hand at the next regular meeting and explain why he had not taken up and retired improvement bonds when sufficient funds were on hand to do. A communication from E. E. Merges requesting the Mayor to appoint a Boxing Commission was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the communication was laid on the table. A petition for the improvement of 23rd Street from the south line of Washington Street southerly to Young's Addition was read and ordered placed on file.

The Council deeming it expedient and necessary that said Street be improved as petitioned for, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of the same, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof.
