

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JULY 11TH. 1922.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the 11th day of July, 1922. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Shindler, Albee and Hart, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. Mayor Snyder stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering the vacation of certain streets and alleys in the Walker Tract of land. A petition signed by Sam G. Marinos, Martha Marinos, Andrew J. Walker and Mary A. Walker, requesting the Council to vacate the following streets, to-wit:

- Broadway Street from the north line of Madison Street to the South line of Washington Street;
- Knox Street from the north line of Madison Street to the South line of Adams,
- and Adams street from the west intersection of the Walker tract to the east intersection thereof. And so much of the public square as is contained in the Walker tract of land, which lies south of Washington Street, also the alleys in Blocks 43 and 44, was read and upon motion duly made and carried, a resolution was adopted directing that notice of the pendency of said petition be given by posting three copies of this resolution in three public places in the Town of Milwaukie for thirty days.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Miller was instructed to deed lots 17 and 20 in Block 2 Quincy Addition to James A. Rigdon upon the payment of the assessments, interest and costs due the Town of Milwaukie. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

Town Hall, Milwaukie, Oregon, August 8th, 1922.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred forty-fifth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 8th day of August, 1922. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews. The minutes of the two hundred forty-fourth regular meeting of the Council held on the 5th day of July, 1922, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 11th day of July, 1922, were read and approved as read. The application of Shirley Buck for a franchise to operate and maintain a trolley spur track across and upon Madison Street and Adams Street was read, and the Council informed Mr. Buck that they were in favor of granting him the franchise provided he would keep the switch points out of the streets. A communication from Thomas Roberts was read requesting the Council to reestablish the grade on Myrtle Street from the Catholic Church and others to open up and lay out a street 40 feet wide from Monroe Street to Washington Street was read and referred to Councilman Hart. A petition of property owners on 31st Street requesting the Council to extend 31st Street from the southerly boundary line of Quincy Addition to take road was read and referred to Mr. Counsell. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee, and upon motion duly made and carried the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment to:

Mr. Counsell made a report on the petition for extending 31st St. to Lake Road, and upon motion duly made and carried, the petition was referred back to Mr. Counsell for another report. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

The two hundred forty-sixth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 12th day of September, 1922. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Miller, Shindler and Hart, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 182, "entitled An Ordinance granting to Southern Pacific Company, Its successors, lessees and assigns the perpetual privilege and franchise to construct, lay down, maintain and operate an industry spur track upon and across Irving Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Miller and Hart. Nays, None. Ordinance No. 182 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, ~~Ordinance No. 182~~ was ~~taken~~ the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 182 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The Council deeming it necessary and to improve said street as petitioned for, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of Myrtle Streets as petitioned for and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof.

Whereupon the City Engineer filed plans and specifications for the improvement of Myrtle Street in accordance with the petition therefor, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof. And said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council the following resolution was read and adopted upon motion duly made and carried, was adopted as read:

Resolution and Notice for the improvement of Myrtle Street from the West Line of Campbell Street to a point 18' East of the center line of Elmer Street.
