The end hundred fourth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 4th day of March, 1919. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. The minutes of the two hundred third regular meeting held on the 4th day of February, 1919, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the Council held on the 14th day of February, 1919, were read and approved as read. Mrs. Johnson was present; and stated that the parents of the boys returning from the Army, contemplated giving an entertainment and dance to raise money to give the boys a banquet on their return home, and that they desired the Council to take charge of the dance in order that it could be run later than 10:00 F. M. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to appoint a committee to look after the dance and intertainment for the City. Mr Prown asked the Council for the use of the City Hall in whichtto hold the convention of the Rebeccas. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Brown was given the use of the City Hall at the customary price for its use. A communication from the Columbia Contract Company to the Street Committee in regard to the price of crushed rock was read and ordered placed on file. Mr. Hanson was present and requested the Council to extend a water main to his property in order that he could be supplied with bull run water. The matter was referred to the Water Committee. Mr Toates asked the Council to repair the street in front of his residence as it was in a very bad condition. Mr Gibbs also ask the council to repair the street in front of his place of business. Upon motion duly made and carried, the street committee was instructed to haul three loads of gravel and repair the street in front of Mr. Gibbs place of business on Harrison Street and to haul about three loads of gravel and repair Monroe Street in front of Mr. Toates house. The matter of laying a side walk on Shindler street was referred to Street Committee. The Marshal was instructed to purchase the necessary lumber and construct drains 6 inches in diameter, the top to be of lumber.4 inches thick and the sides to be 2 inches thick. The application to fine The Thick and the committee. The property of the Tollowing bills were read and allowed by the Finance. Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same: .

Mayor Snyder reported that he made an estimate of the costs of a jail and that if it was attached on the back of the City Hall it would cost about \$697.800 and if not it would cost about \$826.10. The application of Mr. Hanson and three other for buil run water was read and ordered placed on file. As the applicants are not residents of the Town the applications were denied unless they furnish their own mains and connect the same with the City mains. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
