

Town Hall Milwaukie, Oregon, Nov. 7th. 1918.

The two hundred meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 7th day of November, 1918. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Shindler, Grasle, Miller and Bates, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the one hundred ninety-ninth regular meeting of the council held on the 1st day of October, 1918, was read and approved as read. Upon motion of councilman Grasle duly seconded and carried, the Marshal was instructed to repair Lake Road with 3 inch plank. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to notify the Minthorn Springs Water Company to repair the drain box at 40th and Monroe Streets. Upon motion duly made and carried, the south end of Main Street from Washington Street to Lake Road was ordered repaired with gravel 20 feet wide in the center. The matter of the unsanitary condition of the drain from Mr. Harvey's barn and of the septic tank at Mr. Houser's place was referred to Street Committee. The matter of installing an arc light on 32nd Street was left with Mr. Miller to see the P. R. L. & P. Co. and have the light installed. Upon motion duly made and carried, a tax of \$5732.65 was levied on the taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie for the year 1919. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to purchase a gate valve for the fire hydrant at Shindler's Factory building and install the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to have the street gravelled from the Shindler Factory building to north corner of Harvey Road.

The Marshal was instructed to repair water pipes in Lewellyn's building. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

Town Hall Milwaukie, Oregon, December 3rd, 1918.

The two hundred and first regular meeting of the Town Council was held on the 3rd day of December, 1918. The Meeting was called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Shindler, Grasle, Miller and Bates and Seavey, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the regular meeting held on the 7th day of November, 1918, were read and approved as read. Councilman Miller reported that he had ordered an arc light installed at 32nd. Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to write to the County Health Officer and request him to come to Milwaukie and inspect the unsanitary place in said Town. The Recorder and Treasurer were instructed to go to Oregon City and demand from the County Court the road money which is due the Town.
