Upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Morris, the City Engineer, to run the two inch water main in Quincy Addition from 32nd & Wister Streets to Lake Road by the way of 35th Street and to connect the same to the Lake Road main, as per his statement presented to the Council.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 139 was taken up for the first reading. A communication from Mark Levy in regard to repairing the Street in Front of his property was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Committee and Marshal were instructed to make the repairs on said Street that are necessary at this time for the safety of the public, and that the Recorder notify Mr. Levy that such repairs will be made and that if he desire the street improved to present a petition to the Council to that effect. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
