

MEETING OF NOVEMBER 11, 1963

COUNCIL CHAMBER

988TH MEETING

The nine hundred eighty-eighth regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held in the Council Chamber at the City Hall in Milwaukie, Oregon on the eleventh day of November, 1963, commencing at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M. Pacific Standard Time.

The meeting was duly called to order by Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., Chairman of the Council.

The invocation was given by Reverend Cecil Stuurmans, Pastor of Minthorn Community Church.

The roll was called by Council Clerk, Ellen Martin. Those present were: Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr; Councilmen Theron Sedgwick, Robert Richmond, Charles Renard and Walter Freeman, being all of the members of the City Council.

Also present at the meeting were City Manager pro tem Max Thompson, City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Council Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred eighty seventh regular meeting of the Council, held on the fourteenth day of October, 1963 were approved as written.

The minutes of a Special meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-first day of October, 1963 were approved as written.

Mr. John Gleason inquired if there had been a "Park Committee" appointed. The Mayor advised here that there was a Park Committee and that they would meet on Wednesday November 20, at the City Hall.

A group of Citizens from Waverly Heights, was present. It appeared that they had not read the posted notices of the proposed Sewer Trunk Line Hearing. The title of Ordinance Number 992 was read for their benefit. Mr. Ray Mackenzie, 1504 Oxford Lane, spoke on behalf of the property owners, stating that they would prefer the work to be done in June or July as they felt the bids for the work would be higher at this time of year. Mr. Mackenzie also pointed out that there would be need for by-pass lines from the present trunk line to the interceptor sewer, and that the by-pass lines should be installed at the same time the trunk line is laid and that there was need for a storm sewer on Oxford Land and down the hill to the present outfall sewer. Mr. Mackenzie also reminded the Council that Waverly Heights had a surplus in their Fire District Fund and requested that this surplus be applied against the cost of this sewer, as it was their understanding when they annexed, that consideration would be given to this question when the trunk line was installed. There were other questions asked as to why the assessment would be by square foot etc. The majority of these property owners felt that the cost of the sewer should be discounted by the amount to be paid to the City from their Fire Protection Fund, and stated that they annexed their properties on this premise.

Mr. John Foster, 1516 Eaton Lane made inquiry as to maintenance and responsibility for the sewers presently in Waverly Heights, after the trunk line was installed. Mr. Foster was told that sewer system in the City was maintained by the City and that when the sewer in Waverly Heights were accepted, by the City, as part of the City sewer system, they would be the City's responsibility. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Renard that in order to give more study and consideration to this matter, it be tabled until the next regular meeting of the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from the Milwaukie Planning Commission, in which they recommended that the Council accept a proposed twenty-five foot wide roadway, was read. Mrs. Wm. Speight, 3700 Licyntra Lane, stated that their property extended 350 feet south of Kellogg Creek; that their present dwelling was on the north quarter of the property; that they were desirous of selling this dwelling and building a smaller house to the south; that they also would like to sell a part of the property in the south half of the tract; that they would put in a twenty-five foot wide improved road through the property from their proposed building sites to Licyntra Lane; that they would maintain this private road and that they would provide a turn-around at the south end of same. Mrs. Speight was advised that a 25 foot roadway opening into a public roadway was sufficient, and that building permits could be issued to build on the property.

City Manager, Max Thompson read a letter from Oregon State University Department of Civil Engineering, in which they stated that Mr. Donald Peterson had earned an award in connection with his efforts in the field of Water Pollution Control. The Certificate was awarded by the Sewage Operators Certification Committee of Oregon, in the Grade of SWO 1. Mr. Thompson then presented Mr. Peterson with the award.

Ordinance Number 993, AN ORDINANCE providing for the construction of a storm drain sewer along Adams Street, from Main Street to a point approximately 150 feet east of 21st Street, and declaring an emergency; was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had; Ayes: Freeman, Renard, Richmond, Sedgwick, and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 993 was passed by the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 994 was taken up and read for its first reading. There was discussion in which changes were suggested. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Renard that Ordinance Number 994 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at the next regular meeting of the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 995 was taken up and read for its first reading. After discussion it was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance Number 995 be passed to its second reading ; that it be read at the next regular meeting of the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 996 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Sedgwick that Ordinance Number 996 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 996, AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure to annex, without election, certain territory, contiguous to the present boundary of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon on the question of such annexation, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Freeman, Renard, Richmond, Segwick, and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 996 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

A letter from Fire Chief Wickam, in which he recommended the adoption of Mutual Assistance Agreement, was read. After discussion it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Renard that Milwaukie participate in the Mutual Assistance Program and that the Mayor be authorized to sign the agreement Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from the Wichita Water District, Mr. David Brown, Board Member, in which they stated that they did not wish to relinquish any part of their Water System, was read. No action was taken by the Council at this time, on this question.

A letter from Smith Bros. in which they requested that parking be limited to fifteen or twenty minutes in front of their building on Scott Street, was read. After discussion it was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that this portion of Scott Street continue under the same larking regulation as other business areas in the City and that Smith Bros. be informed that the Council does not feel justified in making this one small area an exception. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from Harvey J. Osborn, Attorney, with regard to City Employee Civil Service was read. It was decided that the Council members would meet for a discussion on this matter.

The matter of considering and passing a resolution providing for the issuance and sale of negotiable general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, in the principle sum of \$150,000.00 heretofore authorized by the legal voters of said City; prescribing the form of said bonds and of the interest coupons pertaining thereto; providing for the sale of said bonds and providing for notice of such sale, was taken up.

It was thereupon moved by Councilman Sedgwick and seconded by Councilman Freeman that the following transcribed Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 35-1963

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF NEGOTIABLE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON IN THE PRINCIPAL SUM OF \$150,000.00; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS AND OF THE INTEREST COUPONS PERTAINING THERETO: PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF SAID BONDS; AND PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF SUCH SALE.

WHEREAS, heretofore, on the 15th day of March, 1963, at a special election duly called and held in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, the legal voters of said City duly adopted Chapter VIII*E as an amendment to the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, adopted by the people of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the 7th day of November, 1944, as amended, which provides as follows:

CHAPTER VIII-E

In addition to the other methods provided by the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, or the general laws of the State of Oregon, and not in derogation of any such powers, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, when in its discretion it is deemed advisable, may provide by resolution or resolutions for the establishment, construction, equipment and maintenance of a building to be used for a public library on property now owned by said City within the boundaries of said City, either by contract method or city construction method, or by the combination of both, together with all the appurtenances necessary for the completion and operation of said public library; and to pay the cost thereof, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie is hereby authorized to issue \$150,000.00 in negotiable general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, which shall be paid by an ad valorem tax on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the said City of Milwaukie,

The City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, each year shall provide in the budget for sufficient funds to pay the principal and interest on said negotiable general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, which taxes shall be in addition to all other taxes permitted by the Charter, as amended of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Oregon.

and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to procure funds for the aforesaid purposes and to issue the bonds authorized by said charter amendment so designated as Chapter VIII-E; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED By the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the City of Milwaukie, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, do issue and sell its negotiable general obligation bonds in the principal sum of \$150,000.00 for the purpose of establishing, constructing, equipping and maintaining a building to be used for a public library on property now owned by said City within the boundaries of said City, and to pay the cost thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that said negotiable general obligation bonds shall be dated December 1, 1963, and shall be in the denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each and shall be numbered consecutively beginning with number ONE (1) and ending with number ONE HUNDRED FIFTY (150) and shall be issued to mature serially in numerical order in principal amounts as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED By the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the said bonds shall be the general obligation of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and shall bear interest semi-annually on June first and December first, beginning with June, 1964, at a rate or rates not exceeding five per cent (5%) per annum; that both the interest upon the principal of said bonds shall be paid at the office of the treasurer of said City in any coin or currency which, at the time of payment, is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts within the United States of America; that the said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Recorder of said City and that the interest coupons appertaining to said bonds shall bear the facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the City Recorder; and that, except as to numbers and maturities and such modifications as may be necessary to conform the said bonds to the terms of the successful bid therefor, the said bonds shall be of uniform tenor and read substantially as follows:

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE in CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON, for value received hereby promises to pay to bearer the sum of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS. (\$1,000.00) upon the FIRST DAY OF DECEMBER, 19____, with interest thereon from the date hereof to maturity at the rate of _____ per cent per annum payable semi-annually upon the first days of June and December of each year hereafter to the bearer of the respective coupons therefor hereto attached, upon the presentation and surrender thereof as the said coupons respectively mature. 
Bids submitted must be unconditional, and must be accompanied by a Cashier's Check or Certified Check in favor of the said City, of or upon a bank doing business in Oregon, in the amount of \$3,000.00. The deposit will not draw interest, but will be forfeited to the City as liquidated damages if the bidder to whom the bonds are awarded fails or refuses to complete his or its purchase in accordance with the terms of his or its bid.

The bonds will be delivered complete, without undue delay, at the expense of the City at such city in Oregon as the successful bidder shall name. The legal opinion of Messrs. Shuler, Sayre, Rankin & Myers, of Portland, Oregon, approving the validity of the bonds, will be furnished by the City without cost to the successful bidder.



The Mayor declared the motion carried.

A request for recommendation for renewal of a Retail Malt Beverage Class A. license, was laid before the Council by Mr. Samuel Laird Philip, who will operate the El-Gato at 794 Ochoco Street, when the building is remodeled. Mr. Philip is moving his business (The El-Gato) from McLoughlin Blvd. A letter from Police Chief Brittingham accompanied the application. Chief Brittingham stated that he had made investigation of the El-Gato and of Mr. Philip and that he approved the recommendation for renewal of his license. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Freeman that the Council recommend the renewal of Retail Malt Beverage license (R.M.B.A.) for the El-Gato. Mr. Samuel Laird Philip, Proprietor. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Freeman and seconded by Sedgwick that the Council recommend the renewal of liquor licenses as follows:

Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Thompson reported to the Council that Mr. Davit Hornstein, owner of the Gay Blade, had offered to place a drinking fountain in the sidewalk outside their store at the northwest corner of Main and Monroe Streets. Mr. Thompson explained that the water pipes and drain pipe previously used for a drinking fountain, were still there and the installation of this fountain would not involve opening the street. The Council inquired if or not the drain from the fountain flowed into the street or was piped into the sewer. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that the Gay Blade be permitted to install the drinking fountain and that the City provide water for the same at no cost to the Gay Blade and if the present drain pipe does not drain into the sewer, that the Gay Blade provide a proper drain. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Police Chief's report was read and ordered filed.

Manager Thompson read the low bid for the installation of the storm drain in Adams Street, as follows

The matter of a tape recorder for the Council meetings was again discussed. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Renard that the matter of purchasing a tape-recorder for the Council meetings be tabled. Motion carried and so ordered.
