There being no objection it was passed to second reading and read by title only. There being no objection Ordinance Number 356 was passed to the third and final reading and read by title only. Ordinance Number 356 being put on its passage it was put on its passage with the following result being had:

Noes, None. Ordinance Number 356 passed the Council.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that arrangements be made with Clackamas County to have the City Streets graded. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that parking lanes be painted on Main Street. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that the sale of five small wheelbarrows be authorized. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that the purchase of stamps for the mailing of water bills on November 1st and the purchase of two barrels of road oil be authorized. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the City Engineer investigate the existing street lines of twenty-ninth street and make a survey thereof if necessary.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder issue warrants covering the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, NOVEMBER 6, 1935

A special meeting was held on the 6th day of November, 1935 pursuant to the call of Mayor Sanders for the purpose of taking up the question of getting an option on additional land in connection with the proposal to dig a well for Municipal Water Supply Purposes and for the purpose of taking up such other matters as might require the attention of the Council.

Present: Mayor Sanders, Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh, and Wills; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The matter of getting an option on land adjacent to the City Water tank as the situs of the proposed city well was brought up by Councilman Dell. After considerable discussion it was moved by Walsh and seconded by Shrock that the Water Superintendent secure an option on one of the tracts of the old Long Acres for a period of ninety days at a price not to exceed \$800 for such land and that not to exceed \$5.00 be spent in securing said option. Motion carried and so ordered.

The application of R.E. Neff for the favorable endorsement of the Council on his application for a State License to sell wine was read. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that the application be denied. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter of application for the position of City Stenographer signed by Miss Inez Elliott was read. The Recorder stated that Vivian Farrington and Eloise Spillane were also applicants for such position. After considerable discussion it was moved by Dell and seconded by Walsh that Miss Elliott be hired effective January 1, 1936. Motion carried and so ordered.

No further business coming before the meeting it was adjourned upon motion duly made and carried.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, NOVEMBER 18, 1936

The four hundred tenth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 18th day of November, 1935.

Burdick stated that if the Water Superintendent would accompany him to a meeting of the School Board that he thought the matter could be straightened out. It was moved by Wills and seconded by Burdick that the matter be layed on the table until the next meeting.

Mr. Herriam of the Loggers and Contractors Machinery Company appeared and asked if the City was interested in purchasing a road grader. He was given a negative answer.

Mr. Harry Dean requested that rubbish on Jefferson Street between Main and Twenty-first Streets be removed. The matter was referred to the Street Commissioner.
