Council Chambers, City Hall  
Milwaukie, Oregon  
July 10, 1933.

The three hundred seventy-sixth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 10th day of July, 1933, in the Council Chambers at the City Hall. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh, City Marshal Keck and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the three hundred seventy-fifth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie and the minutes of the special meeting held on the 26th day of June, 1933 and minutes of the special meeting held on the 3rd day of July, 1933, were each read and were each approved as read.

Several citizens resident on 32nd Street in Quincy Addition were present and requested the Council to do something to relieve the dusty condition of said street. Upon motion duly made and carried the matter was referred to the street committee.

City Treasurer Wiseman requested that he be allowed to take a three day vacation. He stated that he had made arrangements to keep his office open. Upon motion duly made and carried the request was allowed.

The Recorder reported that there was not enough money in the City Treasury to pay the current month's bills payable out of the Street, Fire and General Funds. Upon motion duly made and carried the Treasurer was directed to issue checks as far as the Treasury would permit on all warrants and to stamp all unpaid warrants "not paid for want of funds".

Upon motion duly made and carried the Recorder was instructed to notify Mrs. Rader that the City would extend her sixty days within which she could buy lots 17 and 18 in Block 12, Quincy Addition, from the City and if she did not but the property within that time that the same would be sold to third persons.

Ordinance Number 327 entitled: "An Ordinance amending ordinance Number 324 entitled: 'An Ordinance licensing, regulating and controlling the manufacture, sale and distribution of non-intoxicating malt and vinous beverages; fixing the amount of license fees; providing for revocation of licenses; providing other terms and conditions; providing a penalty for violation thereof, and declaring an emergency.'" was read for the first time and the roll call was taken with the following result: Ayes, Dean and Dell; Noes, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Ordinance Number 327 failed to pass the first reading.

Ordinance Number 328 entitled: "An ordinance amending section 21 of Ordinance 161, entitled: 'An ordinance licensing and regulating public dance halls and dances within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon; providing a penalty for the violation thereof and declaring an emergency.'" was read for the first time and the roll call being taken the following result was had: Ayes, Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh; Noes, none. Ordinance Number 328 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried by unanimous vote the rules were suspended and Ordinance Number 328 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call being taken the following result was had: Ayes, Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes; None. Ordinance Number 328 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried by unanimous vote the rules were suspended and ordinance number 328 was taken up for the third and final reading and was read by title only. The roll call being taken the following result was had: Ayes, Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh. Noes, none. Ordinance number 328 passed the third and final reading.

Upon motion duly made and carried it was ordered that a service truck be purchased by the water department at a price not to exceed \$160.00 and that the purchase be made by the Water Committee.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

August 14, 1933.

The three hundred seventy-seventh regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 14th day of August, 1933, in the Council Chambers at the City Hall. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Miller. Present Mayor Miller, Councilmen, Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh, city Marshall Keck and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the three hundred seventy-sixth regular meeting of the Council of the town of Milwaukie were read and were approved as read.

The Treasurer's report for the month of July was read. The Recorder recommended a close economy in all business affairs of the City.

Frank Elder of the Milwaukie Business Men's Club presented a request that the City donate \$100 towards the expense of draining Milwaukie Lake. Upon motion duly made and carried it was ordered that the City donate an amount necessarily sufficient to furnish material relative to the draining and cleaning Milwaukie Lake but in any event not to exceed \$100.

Councilman Shrock requested that the Milwaukie Grange be permitted to place a sign on the sign post located on Front Street at the foot of Harrison Street. Mr. Shrock stated that the Grange would re-set the sign post in concrete. Upon motion duly made and carried the request was granted.

A letter from Mr. John H. Lewis, engineer, in reference to a sewage disposal plant was read. Upon motion duly made and carried the communication was laid on the table indefinitely.

Mr. Wheeler of the Wichita Water District objected to Milwaukie serving consumers located within the boundaries of the Wichita District. Upon motion duly made and carried the Water Superintendent was ordered to cut off all consumers located in the Wichita District except those consumers who had been served by the Town of Milwaukie for a year or more. Mr. Wheeler stated that the arrangement contemplated by the motion was satisfactory to him.

Mr. W. H. Taylor stated that he had old growth wood for sale which he would sell to the City for \$4.50 per cord delivered at the City Hall. Upon motion duly made and carried it was ordered that 15 cords of old growth wood be purchased from Mr. Taylor at \$4.50 per cord delivered at the City Hall.

Mr. S. S. Fields was present and stated that he would consider purchasing warrants now held by the Parker-Schramm Company amounting to \$1546 providing the warrants would not be called for payment for a period of at least one year. The Recorder stated that the warrants would have to be paid as funds became available but that he doubted that there would be sufficient funds in the Street Fund with which to pay the warrants for a year or more, probably two years.

Upon motion duly made and carried the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into an agreement with Mr. Fields relative to the purchase by Mr. Fields of the warrants.

Ordinance Number 329 entitled: "An Ordinance repealing Ordinances numbered 2, 3, 6, 10, 23, 28, 50, 108, 109, 150, 151 and 153" was read for the first time
