

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DECEMBER 14TH. 1915.

The one hundred sixty-fifth (165) regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, councilmen Grasle, Counsell and Skulason, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the one hundred sixty-fourth regular meeting held on Nov. 8th, 1915, and the adjourned meeting of the one hundred sixty-fourth regular meeting held on the 16th day of Nov. 1915, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, the bids for installing a water system for Milwaukie were opened and read. The bids were as follows:

Upon motion duly made and carried, the bid of the lumbermens Trust for par and accrued interest for the Monroe Street Improvement Bonds was accepted and the bonds award to said Company. A communication from Florence Olsen granting the Town permission to build a fire Station on her property was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, was accepted and ordered placed on file. A petition of some of the property owners on East Monroe Street requesting the Council to change the name of said Street back to Laurel Avenue was read and upon motion of councilman Skulason seconded by councilman Grasle and carried, the petition was ordered placed on file until the sentiment of the rest of the property owners on East Monroe Street be ascertained.

The petition of the property owners in Durst's Addition asking the Council to drain the water from said Addition was read and referred to the Street Committee and City Engineer. The Application of F. T. Poyson for permission to transfer his liquor license to Pennie Ginsburg was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to transfer the liquor license of F. T. Poyson to Penrie Ginsburg.

The opinion of Clark, Skulason & Clark on the validity of the Front Street assessment was read and ordered placed on file. The matter of taking an appeal to the Supreme Court in the case of wagenburger v. Town of Milwaukie, was postponed until the 28th day of December, 1915.

Mr. Skulason stated ~~that xxxxxx xxxxxxxx inform xxxxxx~~ that Mr. Anderson would accept the sum of \$50.00 for his alleged claim against the Town of Milwaukie for damages. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Grasle and carried, the Treasurer was instructed to send a check for \$25.00 to Mr. Robbins, attorney for Mr. Anderson, in payment in full of his alleged claim against the Town.

The Street Commissioner reported that the Portland and Oregon City Railroad Company had failed to repair the Streets as requested to do so by the Council, and had failed to place them in the condition they were before its rails had been laid on the streets. Upon motion of councilman Skulason seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance revoking the franchise granted to the Portland and Oregon City Railroad Company, and post a copy of the same as required by the Town Charter.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Town's account against Jeffry & Bufton for a balance of \$50.00 for the use of the Roller was turned over to Johnson & Mathews for collection. Upon motion of councilman Skulason seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the bid of Geibisch & Joplin for \$22,542.40 for the instillation of the Milwaukie water system was accepted, and the Recorder was instructed to notify Geibisch & Joplin that the Town would enter into a contract with them as soon as the Town received the money for the water bonds. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to return the checks to the unsuccessful bidders.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same.:

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DECEMBER 28TH. 1915.

An adjourned meeting of the one hundred sixty fifth regular meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, councilmen Grasle, Peery and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Treasurer Streib, and Marshal Riley. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by Councilman Peery and carried, Clark, Skulason & Clark were instructed to take an appeal to the Supreme Court from the decision in the case of Hagenburger v. Town of Milwaukie.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into a contract, on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, with the P. R. L. & P. Co. for lighting the Town during the year 1916.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the matter of putting in a new culvert across Harrison Street was referred to the Street Committee and Street Commissioner with full power to act.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the report of the Street Committee recommending that the petition of the property owners in Durst's Addition asking the Council to drain the water from said Addition be not allowed, was adopted.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JAN. 11TH. 1916.

The one hundred sixty-sixth (166) regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, Councilmen, Grasle, Skulason and Counsell; Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the one hundred sixty-fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the 14th day of Dec. 1915, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting held on the 28th day of Dec. 1915, were read and approved as read. The report of the Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. A communication from U'ren & Hesse, attorneys for Theodore and B. M. Fisch, in which they offered to sell the Town of Milwaukie, all the water works and water system belonging to the Milwaukie Water Company at the time of the Arbitration proceedings, for \$6500.00 was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the same was laid on the table. The Council informed Mr. U'ren that if the Milwaukie Water Company would submit an offer in writing to take \$6500.00 for their entire water works and water system as it now stands, that a special meeting of the Council would be called to consider the same. The resignation of Claude C. Peery as councilman of the Town of Milwaukie was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, his resignation was accepted. Upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was read and adopted as read: Whereas, councilman J. R. Bond has moved away from the Town of Milwaukie and has ceased to be an inhabitant thereof, and has been absent from two successive council meeting,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that his office as councilman in Ward #1 in said Town of Milwaukie be and the same is hereby declared vacant. Nominations being declared in order to fill the vacancy in the Council caused by the resignation of Claude C. Peery, the following persons were nominated: Casper Kerr and W. R. Taylor. W. R. Taylor receiving a majority votes caste was duly declared elected ~~xxxxxxx~~ councilman of the Town of Milwaukie to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Claude C. Peery. Herman Loeding and J. H. Snyder were placed in nomination to succeed J. R. Bond as councilman in ward #1 in Milwaukie, Oregon. Mr Loeding receiving the majority of votes caste was duly elected councilman of the Town of Milwaukie to serve until his successor is duly elected and qualified.
