

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, OCTOBER 23RD. 1925.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred eighty-third regular meeting of the Council was held on the 23rd. day of October, 1925. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Ramsey, Kerr and Hazen, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck, and Treasurer Streib.

A petition for the construction of a sewer in the Town of Milwaukie was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the construction of a sewer as per petition in accordance with the preliminary survey, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare the assessment roll for Jackson Street improvement. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on Jackson Street improvement fund for \$537.75 in favor of W/.R. Strange, payment in full for Jackson Street improvement. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Supt. was instructed to look after the sidewalk on Washington Street between Main Street and Front Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, NOVEMBER 10TH. 1925.

The two hundred eighty fourth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 10th day of November, 1925.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen McIntyre, Hazen, Kerr, Grasle and Ramsey, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred eighty-third regular meeting of the Council held on the 13th day of October, 1925, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the two hundred eighty third regular meeting of the Council held on the 23rd day of October, 1925, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, a special tax of \$10,149.00 was levied upon the taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the uses and purposes of the Town of Milwaukie for the year 1926, which special tax to be apportioned among the different funds as follows: General fund--- \$5165.00; Street fund--- \$3450.00; Fire Department fund--- \$1220.00 and Emergency fund-- \$314.00. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 233 was taken up for the first reading. The Ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Ramsey, Kerr, Grasle, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 233 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 233 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Ramsey, Kerr, Grasle, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 233 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 233 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The rollcall showed the following result; Ayes, Ramsey, Kerr, Grasle, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 233 passed the third and final reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 234 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Ramsey, Kerr, Grasle, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 234 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 234 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Ramsey, Kerr, Grasle, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 234 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 234 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Ramsey, Kerr, Grasle, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 234 passed the third and final reading. The proposed contract between the City of Portland and the Town of Milwaukie for supplying the Town of Milwaukie with bull run water was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed and directed to execute said proposed contract on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, in quadruplicate, with the City of Portland for supplying the Town of Milwaukie with bull run water for a period of two years from the 1st day of December, 1925. Mr. Smith and others residing on Jackson Street were present and objected to the acceptance of the improvement of Jackson Street on the grounds that the gravel used was of poor quality it being mostly sand. Upon motion duly made and carried, the objections to the acceptance of the improvement of Jackson Street were over-ruled, and the improvement of said street was accepted. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Toates and Mr. Hazelton to remove the dirt from the street in front of their property. Upon motion duly made and carried the recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the Street fund in favor of Curtis Gardner in part payment of the cost of the construction of the bridge across Monroe Street. A communication from U. V. Dorais requesting the permission of the Council to paint the City Hall curtains without cost to the Town was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the request was granted. The petition of property owners along Harvey Street requesting the Council to install some arc lamps on Harvey

Street was read and referred to the Light Committee. Mr. Plimpton was present and offered to give his water system to Milwaukie if Milwaukie would supplies his water consumers with bull run water.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the matter was referred to the Water Committee. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the future meetings of the Council be held at 7:30 o'clock P. M. instead of 8:00 o'clock P. M. The proposed assessment to pay the cost of the improvement of Jackson Street, between 40th. Street and 42nd. Street was read and upon motion, duly made and carried, the 8th. day of December, 1925, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M. of day was the time set for hearing objections to said proposed assessment. The following resolution was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Resolution was adopted as read and the Recorder was instructed to mail a copy of the Resolution to the County Court of Clackamas County; to W. H. Counsell and to R. S. Milln, City Engineer:

RESOLUTION. 8-1925

Whereas, the City of Milwaukie by a vote of its taxpaying Citizens voted a bond issue of the sum of \$30,000.00 for the purpose of improving the streets of our city with hard surface pavement,

And Whereas, the County Court was willing to co-operate with us in this project by doing this work at cost of material and labor plus 10% for wear and tear of machinery,

And, whereas, this cost was much below the regular contract price, which enabled the city of Milwaukie to do much more paving for the money expended than could otherwise have been made possible.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Council tender a vote of thanks and appreciation to the County Court of Clackamas County, and also to Mr. W. H. Counsell, County Road Supervisor, and to Mr. Milln, City Engineer, for the splendid services they have rendered the City of Milwaukie in the completion of this good work. Moved by Councilman Hazen and seconded by councilman Ramsey that the Town of Milwaukie pay for the paving in front of W. H. Counsell's property. Motion withdrawn. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance requiring all buildings constructed in the business district of Milwaukie, Oregon, to be of concrete, tile, brick or stone.
