COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON APRIL 1, 1935

A special meeting of the Council was held on the 1st day of April, 1935 pursuant to the call of President of the Council Sanders, for the purpose of considering Ordinances Number 349 and 350 and considering such other business as might require the attention of the Council.

Present: Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Wills.
Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley and Recorder Adams.

Ordinance Number 349 Entitled "An Ordinance providing building regulations and providing a penalty" was taken up and read for the first time. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that Ordinance Number 349 be taken up for the second time and be read by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. The ordinance was read for the second time. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that Ordinance Number 349 be taken up for the third and final reading and be read by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 349 was read for the third time and put on its passage. Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Wills. Ordinance Number 349 passed the Council.

Ordinance Number 350 Entitled "An Ordinance granting and giving to the Portland General Electric Company, an Oregon Corporation, its successors and assigns, the right and privilege to ground neutral wires of its alternating current electric lighting system to underground water service pipes of the water main system owned by the City of Milwaukie" was taken up and read for the first time. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that Ordinance Number 350 be taken up for the second time and be read by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that Ordinance Number 350 be taken up for the third and final reading and be read

by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 350 was read for the third time and put on its passage. Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Wills. Ordinance Number 350 passed the Council.

The matter of an extension of the S.E.R.A. project was taken up. Upon inquiry it was ascertained that the budget allowance for street construction and repairs had been exhausted. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that all city S.E.R.A. street projects be discontinued at once. Motion carried and so ordered.

No further business coming before the meeting it was adjourned upon motion duly made and carried.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, APRIL 8, 1935

The three hundred ninety-sixth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 8th day of April, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by Acting Mayor Sanders.

Present: Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Sanders, Shrock, and Wills, Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the three hundred ninety-fifth meeting and of the special meeting held on the 1st day of April, 1935 were each read and were approved as read.

The Treasurer's report was read and ordered filed.

The Recorder's report was read and ordered filed.

Councilman Dell reported on activities of the Water Committee. He stated that real progress was being made on collections and also stated that the Committee recommended that the water of consumers delinquent in their bills be cut off.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the water to consumers delinquent in payment of bills be cut off. Motion carried and so ordered.

Councilman Wills reported for the Street Committee and stated that the crosswalks on East Monroe Street were in need of repair. Street Commissioner Bevington stated that he would take care of the matter.

Councilman Wills also reported that alley between Jackson and Monroe Streets in Block was heavily covered with debris and was a fire hazard and asked that something be done about it. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Fire Chief take charge of the matter and see that the debris is cleaned out.

Fire Chief Lewellyn requested that he be given one man for two days to assist him in surveying fire hazards. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Marshal assist the Fire Chief in surveying fire hazards in the City. Motion carried and so ordered.

Fire Chief Lewellyn was put in charge of a City Wide Clean up and Paint-up week to be held this spring under his direction.

The matter of renewing the street lighting contract with the Portland General Electric Company was taken up. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Wills that the matter be layed over until the next meeting. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Wills and seconded by Shrock that the Council meet henceforth on the second and fourth Mondays. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. George Arntgen appeared and stated that there was some difficulty over the water bill of Henri Goddard. It was brought out that Mr. Arntgen had connected Mr. Goddard's house to Mr. Arntgen's service. After considerable discussion the matter was put over to the next meeting.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Finance Committee investigate the cost of preparing and outfitting the library. Motion carried and so ordered.

Water Superintendent Bevington stated that the present owners of the Dean property were objecting to paying the water bill incurred by Mr. Dean. It was decided that the bill must be paid.

The following bills were read and it was moved by Wills and seconded by Shrock that the same be paid. Motion carried and so ordered.
