The one hundred seventy-third (173) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Mr. Grasle of the Street Committee reported that he had taken the matter of opening the Street to the new school house up with the School Foard and had suggested that the School Poard call an election to vote money for the purpose of

paying for the opening of the same, and that the School Board had referred the matter to Mr. Goetz to write to the Attorney General to ascertain if such action by the School Poard would be legal. Mr. Zanders, clerk of the School Poard, informed the Council that the Attorney General had referred them to the District Attorney, who had informed the School Poard that the School District could not legally appropriate money for the purpose of opening the Street.

A petition from School District No. 1 requesting the Council to take the necessary action to open 27th avenue to Foster Road was read and referred back to School Poard. The report of the Recorder and Treasurer on the Fast Monroe Street improvement fund was read and ordered placed on file. The matter of the delinquent assessments for the improvement of East Monroe Street was referred to the Finance Committee. A communication from Mrs. J. M. Stuckey requesting a Kennel License was read, and was Granted a special permit for \$5.00 revocable at any time. A communication from Herman Loeding requesting the Council to repair the

sidewalk in front of his property on Harrison Street was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Committee was instructed to make the nesessary repairs. The Marshal was instructed to Notify Mr. Loeding to pay the bill he owes to the Town-for dirt hauled on his property. Snyder was duly appointed councilman to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Harlow. The Recorder was instructed to prepare roviding for the cutting of thistles and other obnoxious on Vacant lot and tracts of land within the Town of Milwaukie, and post a copy thereof inmaccordance with the Town Charter. The Recorder was instructed to notify the property owners who had failed to pay their assessment for the improvement of an ordinance Monroe Street, that their assessments were delinquent and unless the same was paid by the 1st day of September, 1916, the Town would proceed to collect the same in accordance with the Chapter at the City Charter. Upon notion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

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
