

SPECIAL MEETING OF JULY 30, 1962

A special meeting of the Milwaukie Planning Commission was held on the thirtieth day of July 1962, for the purpose of investigation of traffic signs on McLoughlin Blvd. at Ochoco Street.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Earl Burdick.

Present: Chairman Earl Burdick; Commissioners Leonard Mullan, Earl Clay, Cecil Nickles, Henry Stewart and Roger Hollingsworth. Absent: Commissioners Marvin Shrock and John Sheldahl. Also Present were John Coursey, Walter Freeman and Stanley Federman representing A.I.M. (Action in Milwaukie)

A letter from Rex D. Womack, Owner-Manager of Chalet Motel at 9000 McLoughlin Blvd. in which he called attention to traffic signs recently placed along McLoughlin Blvd, was read.

It was moved by Nickles and seconded by Stewart that a committee from A.I.M., the Chief of Police and the City Manager, investigate the situation and bring in recommendation to the Planning Commission. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hollingsworth and seconded by Clay that Attorney Sheldahl be directed to investigate the State Highway Department Authority concerning the putting up of traffic signs within the City Limits of Milwaukie. If they are usurping the authority of the City of Milwaukie, that he be directed to write a letter from the Planning Commission to the City Council, advising them of the action of the Highway Dept. and that the City Council take the matter up with the State Highway Department. Motion carried and so ordered.

A proposed Plat of the Baker property, east of Linwood Ave. was presented for a check up of street names. A list of ~~twelve names of trees~~ was proposed and will be checked at the Post office for duplicates, by Chairman Burdick, and furnished to the platters.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
