An adjourned meeting of the three hundred seventieth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 10th day of January, 1933. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh, Marshal Keck and Recorder Adams. The minutes of the three hundred sixty-ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the 12th day of December, 1932, and the minutes of the three hundred seventieth regular meeting of the council held on the 9th day of January, 1933, were read and approved as read.

Mayor Miller announced the following committee appointments for the years 1933 and 1934:

Mayor Miller spoke briefly on the finances of the City and urged the necessity of practicing economy in city affairs.

Mr. C. D. Phillips, auditor employed by the council to audit the city's lien and bond docket, presented his report on the same in the form of a letter which was read and ordered filed.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that all city records and record books be kept at the City Hall.

Mr. Dodge made application for a permit to dump piling in the Willamette River at the foot of Jefferson Street on the waterfront. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that a permit be issued to Mr. Dodge if and when he put up a proper bond which would indemnify the city against damage to the streets and/or to the sewer outlet on the waterfront caused by Mr. Dodge and his associates in their operations.

Mr. R. S. Ramsey as chairman of a committee of the Milwaukie Business Men's Club made a request that the city undertake immediately to connect Wister Street and Lake Road by putting through, grading and graveling at least one of the following streets: Thirty-Second, Thirty-Third, Thirty-Fourth and Thirty-Fifth. Mr. Ramsey's arguments were that a connection between Wister Street and Lake Road was desirable and that such work could now be done very cheaply and would serve to help relieve the local unemployment situation. Mr. Porter, City Engineer, was present and offered to donate his services in order to take care of the engineering required on the project. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the request of the Business Men's Club be referred to the Street Committee with full power to act.

Mr. R. S. Ramsey stated that part of the sidewalk abutting the property of Fred Hager on 27th Street had been removed and clay filled in to take the place of the sidewalk and that the clay constituted dangerous and disagreeable footing. The matter was referred to the Street Commissioner.

Mr. W. H. Taylor stated that a group of citizens were interested in having a sewer put in on Harrison Street between Brownell Street and Thirty-Second Street. The Council advised Mr. Taylor that while it was not unfriendly to the proposal, yet it could not act until the matter was brought before it by petition.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Relief Agent C. O. Wilson was granted permission to use any upstairs room in the City Hall as his headquarters.
