The meeting was called for the purpose of hearing a report on the one-way street system, as well as other business.

REQUEST FROM JOE BERNARD RE SIGN

Joe Bernard, 1905 - 35th, requested Council permission to change the gasoline sign at his garage at 21st and Washington, the sign being in the street right-of-way. The placement of the sign will not be changed, the top of the sign will merely be replaced to indicate a different gasoline to be sold.

It was moved by Martin, seconded by Stochosky, to allow Joe Bernard to change the sign and leave the sign and post in place for a maximum period of six months, or the completion of remodeling, whichever is first. Motion carried and so ordered.

REPORT ON ONE-WAY STREET SYSTEM

Report from the City Manager on the above subject, dated July 17, 1972, was read. It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Martin, that the Council approve the continuation of the one-way grid on the basis of both surveys, and on the basis of recommendation that the stop signs as recommended be put in, and that it be implemented the way the survey indicated. Motion carried and so ordered.

DISCUSSION OF AUDITOR'S LETTER

Frank Fairly, auditor for the city, stated that his letter of June 26, 1972, merely reiterated points that had been made in the audit report for 1970-71, as a reminder to city staff.

The City Attorney was asked to write a legal opinion to the Council concerning the effect of the Charter debt limitation on purchase of property over the amount of \$5000.

REPORT ON PARKING DISTRICT REFINANCING

The City Manager reported the ordinance on the Bancroft bonds states they are not recallable until June, 1974.

Council requested a report on what would be a feasible increase for the charge for monthly parking in the city parking lot.

PROCLAMATION RE DOWNTOWN CLEANUP

It was moved by Martin, seconded by Hupp, that the Mayor proclaim from this day until the Milwaukie Festival as "Clean-up and Sharpen-up Time."
