The Street Supt. was instructed to install two stop signs on each side of the Grammer School and the Junior High School; and to place some screenings on 32nd. Street and Elmer Street and fill the holes on Railroad Avenue with screenings. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mrs. Hazen was instructed to see Mr. Phillips in regard to auditing the city books. The bill of Dr. Ross for medical services performed for Mr. Keck was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the same was laid on the table. The request of the East Milwaukie Progressive Club for the use of the East Milwaukie Fire Station to hold its meetings in was denied by the Council.
