The two hundred sixtieth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the 13th day of November, 1925. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Fresent, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen, Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred fifty nineth regular meeting of the Council held on the 9th day of October, 1923, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 13th day of October, 1923, were read and approved as read.

Ordinance No. 202 entitled, "An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds pursuant to the provisions of the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and sections 3788 to 3796, both inclusive, of Oregon Laws, and declaring an emergency", was read and ordered posted as required by the City Charter. Ordinance No. 203 entitled", An Ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds pursuant to the provisions of the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and sections 3788 to 3796, both inclusive, of Oregon Laws, and declaring an emergency," was read and ordered posted as required by the City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to preparing an answer in the case of the Hawley Pulp & Paper Co. vs. Town of Milwaukie, disclaiming any interest in the property described in the complaint and file the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council took no action at this time in regard to revoking the franchise of the Fortland Southern R. R. Co.

The Recorder was instructed to notify the Fortland Gas & Coke Company

to repair the excavations it had made in the Streets. The Report of the Viewers on the proposed extension of 27th. Street was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to precare an Ordinance adopting said report and post the same as required by the City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, Tuesday the 4th day of December, 1923, at the hour of 7:00 o'clock P. M. of said day was the time set for hearing objections, if any, to the report of the Viewers on the proposed extension of 27th. Street. The Street Supt. was instructed to notify the property owners to clean the sidewalks in front of their property.

Moved by Councilman Miller and seconded by Councilman McIntyre that no more public meetingsbe allowed in the City Hall. Motion-withdrawn.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the proper red lights be placed to mark the exit at the front and rear doors of the City-Hall. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance
