Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Miller was instructed to deed Lots 39 and 40 in Block 44, Minthorn Addition instead of lots 41 and 40 in Block 44, Minthorn Addition, to G. C. Patton. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for proposal for the improvement of 23rd. Street, in The Daily Record Abstract for a period of five days, said proposals to be opened on the 25th day of July, 1923, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M. of said day. The Light Committee was instructed to look after the removal of the light and telephone poles on 29th. Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to have the Contractor construct two round corners on 29th and Harrison Streets and two round corners on 29th and Monroe Streets, the cost thereof to be paid out of the general fund. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in the amount of \$1000.00 on the 31st Street fund in favor of H. W. Oliver as part payment of the improvement of said street, and a warrant in the amount of \$500.00 on the East Harrison Street fund as part payment of the improvement thereof. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned until the 25th day of July, 1923.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JULY 25TH, 1923.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred fifty-sixth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 25th day of July, 1923. Meeting called to order by J. J. Miller, acting Mayor. Present, J. J. Miller, councilmen, Johnson, Kerr, McIntyre and Riley, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. Upon motion duly made and carried, the proposals for the improvement of 23rd. Street were opened and read, which proposals were as follows: Peterson & Scott... \$1284.00

H. W. Oliver... \$1087.66.

H. W. Oliver having submitted the lowest bid for the improvement of 23rd. Street, upon motion duly made and carried, the contract for the improvement of 23rd. street was awarded to H. W. Oliver for the sum of \$1087.66, and the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into a contract on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie with H. W. Oliver for the improvement of 23rd. Street.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to return to Peterson & Scott the certified check accompanying their bid for the improvement of 23rd. Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to notify Mr. Binn to remove the obstructions from Adams Street within ten days and if he did not do so to remove the obstructions from said Street. Moved by Councilman Kerr that the Recorder be instructed to prepare an ordinance reducing the water rate within the Town of Milwaukie from \$1.50 per month for 300 cubic feet to \$1.00 per month for 300 cubic feet and raising the rate to \$0.25 per 100 cubic feet for all water used over 300 cubic feet. Motion lost. H. W. Oliver having completed the improvement of East Harrison Street to the satisfaction of the Council, upon motion duly made and carried, the 14th day of August, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M. of said day was fixed as the time and City Hall as the place for considering the acceptance of the improvement of said Street and hearing objections thereto.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the East Harrison Street fund in favor of Mr. Oliver for the balance due him for the improvement of said Street. Mr. Bridwell was present and advised the Council that if the Council would pay for the use of A Roller to roll East Harrison Street that he would roll the street without any pay for his services. Upon motion duly made and carried, the proposition of Mr. Bridwell was accepted. No further business coming before the Council upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
