Town Hall, Milwaukie, Oregon, June 4th. 1919.

The ^{two} one hundred and seventh regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Frutchey, Grasle, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the one hundred sixth regular meeting held on the 6th day of May, 1919, and the minutes of the special meetings of the Council held the 9th and 16th days of May, 1919, were read and approved as read. A communication from Judge Anderson informing the the Council that Clackamas County would commends paving Main Street in about ten days was read and ordered placed on file. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Counsell was instructed to purchase the necessary lumber for crosswalks. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Committee was instructed to have a new top surface put on Lake Road from Main Street to about 200 feet east. Mr. Counsell was instructed to fill the hole in 32nd Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was instructed to dig holes in Front Street and recork the water pipes and repair the leaks. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Frutchey was instructed to look after the City's interest in the deal with Mr. Gibbs to rent or buy a motor from the Town. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to collect the dog licenses and that the be paid 10% of the amount collected. A communication from B. I. Hagerman requesting the Council to do what they could toward getting a telegraph Station fro Milwaukie, was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the matter was laid on the table for the present. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 162 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following results, Ayes, Frutchey, Miller, Hart and Counsell. Nays, Grasle. Ordinance No. 162 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 162 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results. Ayes, Frutchey, Miller, Hart and Counsell. Nays, ~~xxxx~~ Grasle. Ordinance No. 162 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 162 was taken up for the third and ~~final~~ final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Frutchey, Miller, Hart and Counsell. Nays, Grasle. Ordinance No 162 passed the third and final reading.
