Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was instructed to repair the hydrant at Island Station and cover the same with a box to prevent freezing. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was instructed to go the water system and install meter where needed and to connect up applicant for water, and to employ such help as is necessary. Upon motion of councilman Rates duly seconded and carried, the salary of the warshal was raised to \$20.00 per month.
