SPECIAL MEETING

The City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, convened in special session at the City Hall in Milwaukie on the 29th day of July, 1968, by call of the Mayor for the purpose of adoption of resolution No. 55-1968 and any other business to come before the Council.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Robert E. Richmond at 8:20 p. m. with the following Councilmen present:

Mr. Maury Payne, State Highway Dept., and Gayle Schwiesow, Babler Bros., came before the Council and requested that the Council reconsider the working hours imposed upon the construction crews working on the Clackamas-Milwaukie Expressway, under Ord. No. 1028, and grant a special permit allowing construction to begin at 6:00 a. m. and continue when necessary to 8:00 p. m. With the present starting hour of 7:00 a. m., it is necessary to continue work through 4:30 when traffic becomes increasingly heavy and chance for an accident increases.

It was moved by Graf, seconded by Clore, that the Attorney be instructed to prepare an ordinance to meet this emergency situation. Motion carried and so ordered.


RESOLUTION NO. 55-1968, Intent to Improve Boyd Street

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Strauss, that the figure of \$9.00 (\$7.50 for streets and \$1.50 for storm sewers), be established as the maximum cost to each property owner per front foot, for the proposed street improvement on Boyd Street, and that Resolution No. 55-1968, (A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY.... TO IMPROVE BOYD ST...) be read and adopted. Motion carried and so ordered with Councilman Graf abstaining.

CHALET L'ABBE DISCUSSION

The City Attorney advised the Council that a written report would be submitted regarding the problems that could arise with the Chalet L'Abbe acquiring a liquor license allowing them to serve cocktails.

As there was no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was duly adjourned at 11:15 p. m.
