

The Recorder asked for authority to prepare and post an ordinance providing for the establishment of the City Ward Lines in accordance with the County Precinit lines. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that the Recorder prepare and post such an ordinance. Carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Wills and seconded by Dell that the Recorder prepare and post an ordinance prohibiting the placing of produce and other foodstuffs to a greater distance than 30 inches on the sidewalks. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Moe appeared and requested a readjustment of his water bill. The application was denied.

Water Superintendent Bevington stated that the owners wanted \$25.00 for an option of \$800 on the proposed well site tract property being Lot 7, Zanders addition to Milwaukie. It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Burdick that Water Superintendent Bevington be authorized to pay \$25.00 for a ninety day option of \$800 on the proposed well site property, Lot 7, Zanders addition to Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder was instructed to contract the Bank of Sellwood in reference to ground for a footpath between 30th Street and the Grammar School.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, DECEMBER 9th, 1935

The four hundred eleventh regular meeting of the Council was held on the 9th day of December, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, and Wills; Water Superintendent Bevington; Marshal Riley; Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred tenth regular meeting of the Council held on the 18th day of November, 1935 were read and approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Mr. Harry Dean appeared before the Council and requested the removal of the rubbish on Jefferson Street between Main and twenty-first streets. The matter was referred to Street Commissioner Bevington.

Mr. Harry Dean and Mrs. Edith Hazen stated that they understood that slot machines were in operation in Milwaukie. The matter was referred to Marshal Riley.

Mrs. Hazen also asked that the chuck-holes and the bank at the corner of Lakeroad and Main Streets be eliminated. The matter was referred to Street Commissioner Bevington.

Fred Sperr asked permission to eliminate the curb adjacent to his property on Jefferson Street. The matter was referred to the Street Commissioner for investigation and report.

The matter of enlarging the roadway at 32nd and Harrison Streets was brought up for consideration by Dell. Burdick offered to donate ground of a radius of ten feet in order to assist in improving the corner. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Shrock that the proffered gift of ground be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

A communication from Walter B. Moery relative to an offer to sell the City a truck was read. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the matter of the purchase of a truck be layed on the table until the next meeting.

The application of Fred W. Kraemer for endorsement of the Council to his application to the State Liquor Commission for a winery license and the applications of Wm. Roetter, Brita Carlson and Vera Milan for endorsement of the Council to their respective applications to the State Liquor Commission for licenses to sell beer were submitted to the Council. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Shrock that the Recorder endorse respectively on each of the applications the recommendation of the Council that the applications be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of the large delinquency of water bills was taken up for consideration. After considerable discussion it was moved by Burdick and seconded by Wills that letters be sent to water users with delinquent water bills advising such users that they must make arrangements to pay their bills at once. Motion carried and so ordered.

Water Superintendent Bevington brought up the question of the disposal of the old two inch water pipe which had been replaced by new pipe. He stated that he had received several offers for the pipe and that the best was that of the Alaska Junk Company on the basis of six cents per foot. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the pipe be sold to the Alaska Junk Company on the basis of six cents per lineal foot. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 358 entitled "An Ordinance regulating the placing of produce, food stuffs, and other goods, wares and merchandise upon the sidewalks of Milwaukie, and providing a penalty" was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. Ordinance Number 358 was read for the second and third times and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Shrock and Wills
Nones: None. Ordinance Number 358 passed the Council.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Shrock that \$1,000 be paid to the Consolidated Supply Co. to apply on the City's account with that company. Motion carried and so ordered.

Water Superintendent Bevington requested authority to purchase a battery for the water service truck. It was moved by Wills and seconded by Dell that the request be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, DECEMBER 23rd, 1935

A special meeting of the Council was held on 23rd day of December 1935 pursuant to the call of Mayor Sanders for the purpose of considering matters relative to the proposal of having a municipal well water supply system and of considering a proposal to submit to the voters of Milwaukie the question of voting bonds for the purchase of a fire truck.

Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

Water Superintendent Bevington reported that the test well had been drilled to a depth of two hundred fifty feet and that water bearing stratas had been struck at the respective depths of 198, 218 and 234 feet and asked that the well be perforated so that proper tests of the water could be made.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Shrock that R.J. Strasser be authorized to perforate the well casing and that he be paid \$25.00 therefore. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Shrock that Mr. Strassers bill for \$218.00 covering cost of casing for the test well be approved and that the Recorder issue a warrant providing for payment of the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 357 entitled "An Ordinance providing for a special election to be held on the 31st day of January, 1936, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to amend the charter of Milwaukie, filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 11, 1905, and to amend all acts amending said act by providing that the Council of Milwaukie may acquire, construct, purchase, own, maintain, manage, and operate a municipal well as a source of water supply for said Milwaukie and vicinity, and providing further a designation of the polling places, judges and clerks of election," was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. No objection being made Ordinance No. 357 was taken up for the second time and read by title only. No objection being made Ordinance No. 357 was taken up for the third time and read by title only. Ordinance No. 357 was put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Dell, Burdick, Shrock, Walsh, and Wills. Noes: None. Ordinance Number 357 passed the Council.

Ordinance Number 358 entitled "An Ordinance providing for a special election to be held on the 31st day of January, 1936, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to amend the Charter of Milwaukie filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 11, 1905, and to amend all acts amending said act by adding thereto Section 22-B authorizing the issuance and sale of Seven thousand, five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) general obligation bonds of said Milwaukie, to provide funds with which to purchase a fire truck and other fire fighting equipment, and providing for the levy of a special tax to pay principal of and interest on said bonds." was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Wills that consideration of Ordinance Number 358 be indefinitely postponed. Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills. Noes: None. Motion carried and so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.
