

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, FEB. 11th. 1929.

The three hundred twenty-third regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 11th day of February, 1929, Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred twenty-second regular meeting of the Council held on the 15th. day of January, 1929, were read and approved as corrected. The Street Committee reported that they would recommend the improvement of Jefferson Street as petitioned for. Upon motion duly made and carried, the city Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of Jefferson Street from 37th. Street easterly to the city limits, as petitioned for, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of 35th. Street as petitioned for and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof.

The matter of patching the pavement on Milwaukie Highway was left to the Street Committee. Moved by Councilman Shindler and seconded by Council Dell that R. S. Milln be employed as City Engineer at the same rates as last year. Motion carried. Councilmen Shindler Dean and Dell voting for the motion and Councilmen Sanders and Earl not voting.

The petition of the city employes requesting to be paid on the 1st day of each month was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to draw warrants on the 1st day of each month in payment of the city employes salaries. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Treasurer was instructed to transfer \$2000.00 from the Water fund to the General fund, the same to be returned to the Water fund as soon as the city receives the first installment of taxes from the County. The report of the City Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to write Mr. R. L. Hageman a letter of appreciation of the Council for his success in getting city delivery of mail for Milwaukie. The requested of Mr. Joseph Dahlman and others for permission to from a city band under the supervision of the Council and the Band Manager was discussed, and upon motion duly made and carried, the request was granted and the Mayor was instructed to appoint an advisory Committee of three members to act in conjunction with the band manager when needed. The Mayor Appointed the following Councilmen as such Committee: W. J. Dell, J. R. Earl and C. F. Dean.

The following resolution was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was adopted as read: Resolution to join the League of Oregon Cities.

Whereas, the objects of the League of Oregon Cities are:

1. To maintain an organization to secure co-operation among the cities of the State in a thorough study of local problems and application of efficient methods of local government.
2. The collection and dissemination of information statistics, and data relative to all questions of local government.
3. The promotion of such legislation as will be beneficial to the cities of the State and citizens thereof, and the prevention of such legislation as may be injurious thereto.
4. To do any and all other things necessary or proper for the benefit of the cities of Oregon.

Whereas, the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, desires to have the advantage of membership in the League of Oregon Cities and give its full share of support to the objects of the same, now therefore, BE IT RESOLVED, by the city council of the city of Milwaukie, Oregon, that this city become a member of the League of Oregon Cities and that the City Recorder is hereby instructed to draw a warrant for \$10.00 in favor of the League of Oregon Cities for the annual membership dues.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, APRIL 8TH. 1929.

The three hundred twenty-fifth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 8th. day of April, 1929. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Sanders, Shindler, Dean and Dell, Acting Recorder Kelso and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred twenty-third regular meeting of the Council held on the 11th. day of February, 1929, were read and approved as read. Councilman Dean reported that he had taken up the matter of repairing Milwaukie Highway with the County officials and that they would take care of this street from this time as it had been classed as a Market Road, and also that the bill sent Milwaukie for repairs last year would be assumed by the County.

Councilman Dell reported that the gravelling and grading of the City Streets had been done and that they were in good shape except a few places where holes had developed. The application of O. F. Witte for a dance hall license to conduct dances in Crystal Lake Park from April 15th. 1929 to April 15th. 1930, was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Witte was granted a dance hall license as requested. Regularly moved and seconded that the matter of the delinquent tax liens on the various tracts of City property be taken up at the next regular meeting. The plans and specifications for the improvement of 35th. Street and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof prepared by the City Engineer and heretofore filed in the office of the Recorder, being satisfactory to the Council, the following resolution and notice was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was unanimously adopted as read:

Resolution and notice of the improvement of 35th. Street northeasterly from Lake Road to the Northerly side of Blocks 20 and 21, Quincy Addition:
