

if the full amount that the street may be bonded for will allow said sub-grading. Addition gravel to be spread, if the full amount that the street may be bonded for will allow the same.

(3). Cement concrete sidewalks four (4) feet wide, four (4) inches thick and eighteen (18) inches from the center lines shall be constructed on both sides of the street and connecting with the existing concrete sidewalks, except, that wooden sidewalks 4 feet in width may be substituted over filled ground, if the City Engineer thinks it to be advisable.

(4). Gutterlines to be fifteen (15) feet from the center of said street.

(5). Provision to be made for such wooden crosswalks and such drainage as the City Engineer shall deem necessary.

(6). All car tracks on said street shall be improved by bringing said tracks to the final grade, by using gravel or other suitable ballast; by replacing all defective ties with new ones and planking the entire area between the rails and for a width of one (1) feet on the outside of rails.

All work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the recorder and adopted by this resolution.

Remonstrances against said improvement may be filed with the Recorder in writing on or before the 10th day of April, 1923.

The Recorder is hereby directed to cause this resolution and notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon. The Report of The State Fire Marshal was read and ordered referred to Fire Committee. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Fields was authorized to remove the trees from 40th Street, between Harrison and Jackson Streets. The question of purchasing a fire gong was left with the Fire Commission. Upon motion duly made and carried, the insurance on the East Milwaukie fire Station was cancelled. Upon motion of councilman Miller and duly second and carried, the Street Committee was instructed to rent the East Milwaukie Fire Station for the highest rental obtainable. M. of said day. The Fire Committee reported that they had purchased a siren, a spotlight and some couplings for the Fire Department. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to purchase a dozen chairs for the Fire Department. Upon motion duly made and carried, Councilman Kerr and Marshal Keck was instructed to look after the City Auto Camp Grounds, and that no charge be made for camping privileges for the first day or to. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to preparing an ordinance regulating the rates to be charged certain water consumers supplied with water. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to establish the grades on the west line of 42nd Street, from King Street to Harrison Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Co to discontinue service to Meter #36589.
