TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE OREGON AUGUST 20. 1912

A special meeting of the town council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Streib who stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of hearing a report of the men who had gathered evidence against the saloons violating the law.

Present Mayor Streib, Councilmen Kelso, Stockton and Lehman.

Upon motion of Lehman seconded by Kelso that Robert Goetz be appointed Recorder Pro Tem. Carried.

Mr. Large reported that he had seen three autos loaded with people enter the tavern after midnight on the previous Sunday and that he and Marshall Davis had entered the place at three oclock in the morning and had seen two men coming from the bar room and that people were seated at the tables in the grill room with liquor on the tables.

Mr. Large and Mr. Kellogg reported that they had bought liquor in the bar room of the Hotell Gratten after 12 oclock. They also reported that they had evidence that the other saloon had violated the law. They then asked that a complaint be not drawn against the hotel or saloon until they had time gather further evidence.

The council then instructed that a complaint be drawn up against the Milwaukie Tavern.

No further business appearing Council Adjourned.
