COUNCIL CHAMBERS, JULY 22, 1935

The four hundred third regular meeting of the Council was held on the 22nd day of July, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Shrock and Walsh;
Water Superintendent Bevington; Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

Water Superintendent Bevington, Engineer Jones and Recorder Adams explained that the City could put in a Works Progress Administration project covering its proposed replacement of water mains and installation of additional and large fire hydrants. After considerable discussion it was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Engineer, Water Superintendent and Recorder make application to the Works Progress Administration for a project or projects covering the replacement of certain water mains and installation of additional fire hydrants. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of a city licensing ordinance was taken up for consideration. After considerable discussion it was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Recorder post the nuisance ordinance number 352 and that the matter of a licensing ordinance be layed on the table until the next meeting. Motion carried and so ordered.

The question of doing away with slot machines was taken up for discussion. No action was taken.

The Fire Chief requested authority to purchase a tarpaulin. The request was denied.

The Water Superintendent requested authority to purchase meter supplies to the value of \$21.00. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Walsh that the authority be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, AUGUST 12, 1935

The four hundred fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 12th day of August, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock and Walsh;
Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred second and four hundred third regular meetings held respectively on the 8th and 22nd days of July, 1935 were each read and were approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Recorder read a letter from the Geo. S. Kerr Co. of Portland

enclosing burglary insurance policy. The Recorder recommended that all insurance be given to local insurance men. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the Finance Committee and Recorder place the insurance with a local agent. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder read the applications of George L. Mathews for a Retail Beer License and for a Package Store Class "A" Beer License. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Walsh that the applications be disapproved. Motion carried and so ordered.

Water Superintendent requested that the purchase of a leak detector for water mains costing approximately \$80.00 be approved. He stated that this equipment would enable him to check the city water mains for leaks and would pay for itself within a short time. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that the purchase of such a leak detector be authorized. Motion carried and so ordered.

The question of the purchase of the City's fuel supply of wood for the winter was taken up. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the City purchase 10 cords of 16 inch old growth fir wood at a price of \$6.00 per cord from J.F. Maurer. Motion carried and so ordered.

C.E. Smith appeared before the Council and requested early action on the proposed trade and business licensing ordinance. The matter was put over until the next meeting.

Ordinance Number 352 entitled "An Ordinance declaring the practice of going in and upon private residences by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant merchants, and transient vendors of Merchandise to be a nuisance and providing a penalty." was taken up and read for the first time. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that Ordinance Number 352 be taken up for the second time and be read by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 352 was taken up for the second time and read by title only. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that Ordinance Number 352 be taken up for the third and final reading and be read by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 352 was taken up for the third time and read by title. Ordinance Number 352 being put on its passage the following result was had. Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Shrock and Walsh, Noes, None. Ordinance Number 352 passed the Council.

The Mayor brought up the question of a well for a water supply. It was decided to lay the matter over until more figures are available concerning the cost of a well.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder issue warrants for the same.
