

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, OCTOBER 18TH. 1926.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 18th. day of October, 1926. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Kerr, Grasle, Frey and Hazen, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. Mayor Cowell stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering the matter of granting Mr. Sims a permit to construct a temporary structure within the Business District of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, Mr. Sims agreed to use steel posts in the structure and galvanized iron for siding. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Sims was granted a revocable permit to erect a temporary fire proof structure within the business district of the Town of Milwaukie, said structure to be removed within 18 months from this date, or sooner if said permit should be revoked.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, NOVEMBER 4TH. 1926.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 4th. day of November, 1926. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Ramsey, Kerr, Frey and Hazen, and Recorder Mathews. Mayor Cowell stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering the enforcement of the building ordinance.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Sims was given until the 9th. day of November, 1926, to comply with the conditions prescribed by the Council in the construction of his temporary structure by putting in steel posts and galvanized iron siding.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the building ordinance be enforced. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Bates was given until the 1st day of March, 1927, to comply with the building ordinance. Councilmen Ramsey and Kerr voting against the motion and Councilmen Frey and Hazen and Mayor Cowell voting for the motion.
