TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DECEMBER 6TH. 1921.

The two hundred thirty-seventh regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 6th day of December, 1921. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Miller, Shindler, Albee and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred thirty sixth regular meeting of the Council held on the 216th day of November, 1921, were read and approved as read. The opinion of Mr. Skulason as to whether or not the Town has jurisdiction of Harvey Street was read and placed on file.

Inasmuch as there is some doubt about the Town having jurisdiction over Harvey Street, upon motion duly carried, the bids for the improvement of said Street was returned to the bidders without being opened. Upon motion duly made and carried, W. H. Counsell was appointed as second viewer to assess benefits and damages resulting from the extension of Harrison Street, and the 10th day of January, 1922, at hour of 9:00 o'clock A. M. was the time and the City Hall the place appointed and fixed for the meeting of the Viewers. Mr. Counsell advised the Council that he had completed the gravelling of Railroad Avenue. The Recorder was instructed to send the S. P. Co. a bill for \$275.00, that amount being its part of the cost of gravelling said Street. The Mayor was instructed to ascertain what it would cost to acquire jurisdiction over Harvey Street and report at the next meeting of the Council.

The Recorder was instructed to notify the Telephone Company that the service in Milwaukie was very unsatisfactory.
