

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JUNE 9TH. 1914.

The one-hundred-forty-seventh (147) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Polstad and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the 146 regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie held on the 12th day of May, 1914, and the adjourned meetings of the 146 regular meeting held on the 23rd and 28th days of May, 1914, were read and approved as corrected.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance committee, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the separate funds in payment of the same:

The report of the Treasurer was read and referred to the Finance Committee. A communication from Mr. Daly of the Portland Water

Commission in regard to furnishing the Town of Milwaukie with Bull Run water was read, and ordered placed on file. A communication from F. E. Olson objecting to the manner of drainage provided in the plans and specifications for the improvement of ~~Front~~ ^{Monroe} Street was read and referred to the Street Committee. Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the bids for the improvement of ~~Front~~ ^{Monroe} Street were opened and read. The bids were as follows: W. H. Counsell, \$8742.15. O. M. Patton, \$7808.26. The bids were referred to the Street Committee, which Committee recommended that the bid of O. M. Patton be accepted, his bid being the lowest. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the bid of O. M. Patton was accepted and the Mayor and Recorder was instructed to enter into a contract, on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, with Mr. Patton for the improvement of Monroe Street. Ordinance No 110 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent, councilman King. Ordinance No. 110 passed the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 110 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Albee and Counsell. Nays, none. Absent, King. Ordinance No. 110 passed the second reading. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 110 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-called showed the following results; Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent, councilman King. Ordinance No. 110. passed the third and final reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 109 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent, King. Ordinance No. 109 passed the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 109 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result. Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent councilman King. Ordinance No. 109 passed the second reading. Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 109 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Albee and Counsell. Nays, none. Absent, councilman King. Ordinance No. 109 passed. Upon motion councilman Albee seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the recorder was instructed to advertise for proposals for the improvement of Laurel Avenue, the contractor to make arrangements with the property owners along said street for the cost of the improvement over and above the assessed valuation of the property assessed for said improvement. An ordinance granting the Clackamas County Gas Company a franchise to lay gas mains within the Town of Milwaukie was read and ordered posted. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned subject to the call of the Mayor.
