The Recorder reported that the County desired that the City contribute five dollars per month and the lights and water to the maintenance of quarters for the WPA sewing project in Milwaukie. It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Wills that the City contribute five dollars for rent, the water and lights for the WPA sewing project in the City for a period not exceeding four months. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Wills and seconded by Walsh that the services of L. A. Maple as traffic officer be discontinued. Ayes: Dell, Walsh and Wills; Noes; Shrock, Not-voting Burdick. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Wills that the Recorder prepare and post an ordinance requiring that operators of beer parlors in the City must have male bar tenders on duty. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Council declare itself as limiting the number of retail beer licenses in the City to three. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 359 entitled: "An Ordinance relating to the parking of vehicles in Milwaukie and prohibiting the making of reverse turns on Front Street." was taken up for consideration and was read for the first time. There being no objection Ordinance Number 359 was read for the second time by title only. There being no objection Ordinance Number 359 was read for the third and final time by title only. Ordinance Number 359 was put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills; Noes, None. Ordinance Number 359 passed the Council.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MARCH 9, 1936

The four hundred fifteenth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 9th day of March, 1936.

Present: Mayor Sanders, Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred thirteenth and four hundred fourteenth regular meetings of the Council were read and were approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

David Mathews appeared before the Council and presented a petition in opposition to the sale of a tract of land on Harrison Street adjacent to his property, if the property was to be used as the site of a sheet metal shop. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that the matter of selling the land be layed on the table. Motion carried and so ordered.

The following bids were opened in reference to the drilling of a twelve inch water supply well:

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Shrock that the bid of R.J. Strasser for the drilling of a twelve inch water supply well be accepted and that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to enter into a contract on behalf of the City with Mr. Strasser covering the drilling of the well. Motion carried and so ordered.

The application of Ernest McLaughlin for a retail beer license recommendation was presented to the Council. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that the Council recommend that a retail beer license be granted to Mr. McLaughlin. Motion carried and so ordered.
