

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, FEBRUARY 10, 1936

The four hundred thirteenth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 10th day of February, 1936.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred eleventh and four hundred twelfth regular meetings held respectively on the 13th and 27th days of January, 1936 and of the special meeting held on the 3rd day of February, 1936 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Mr. Kreis, attorney for Brita Carlson, appeared before the Council in reference to Mrs. Carlson changing the location of her beer parlor. Mr. Kreis expressed the opinion that Mrs. Carlson could have her beer license transferred without bringing the question before the Council. There being no application for endorsement of a transfer of the beer license of Mrs. Carlson before the Council the matter was dropped.

The Recorder recommended that \$5000.00 of Sewer bonds be refunded since the City will probably be unable to pay the bonds on maturity and since bonds can be issued and sold on the present market at a much lower interest rate. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the Recorder institute proceedings to refund \$5000.00 of Sewer Bonds. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Burdick that Len. A. Maple be hired for an additional month as city traffic officer at a salary of \$35.00 per month. Motion carried and so ordered.

The question of the purchase of a truck for the Street Department was taken up for consideration. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Shrock that Street Commissioner Bevington and Recorder Adams prepare specifications for a truck and that the Recorder advertise for bids on the sale to the City of a truck, said bids to be opened at the Council Meeting on February 24th.

Harry Dean brought up the question of the City helping to establish quarters for a PWA sewing project in Milwaukie. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Shrock that the matter be postponed until the next meeting and that the Recorder investigate the same and report thereon at the next meeting.

The Recorder brought up the question of the City securing a 1936 membership in the League of Oregon Cities. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that a \$10.00 membership be obtained. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the Recorder advertise a call for bids to furnish a deep well turbine pump for the six inch test well, said bids to be opened at the Council meeting on February 24th. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the Recorder advertise a call for bids to drill a twelve inch well, said bids to be opened at the Council meeting on March 9th. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Wills that the purchase of a four month's supply of water statements, stamped envelopes and meter reading sheets, file cards and two barrels of asphalt be authorized. Motion carried and so ordered.

Councilmen Shrock reported that the Portland General Electric Company was not complying with the provisions of its lighting contract in that it was turning the lights on late and off early. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that the January bill for street lighting be discounted ten percent. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder issue warrants covering the same.
