Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 289 entitled, "An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds pursuant to the provisions of the Charter of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the amendments thereto, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Shrock, Earl and Dell. Noes, none, Ordinance No. 289 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 289 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 289 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. Upon motion duly made and carried, all the petitions heretofore filed requesting the installation of street lamps were laid on the table. The matter of grading the street was left with the Street Committee. Upon motion duly made and carried, the matter of improving 35th. Street was postponed until the first regular meeting to be held in February, 1929. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was authorized to purchase 50 concrete meter boxes from Collins Concrete Pipe Company at a price of \$1.35 per box. The report of the City Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to purchase the necessary supplies for the election.
