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TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JULY 11TH. 1916.

The one hundred seventy-second (172) regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, councilmen, Grasle, Harlow, Shindler and Counsell, recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the regular meeting held on the 13th day of June, 1916, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 23rd day of June, 1916, were read and approved as read. The resignation of Herman Loeding as Councilman of the Town of Milwaukie was read and upon motion duly made and carried,, the resignation of Mr. Loeding was accepted. Andrew Wilson and John M. Snyder were nominated to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Loeding. The nominations being closed the rollcall showed the following results: For Mr. Snyder, councilman Grasle and for Mr. Wilson, councilmen, Harlow, Shindler and Counsell. Mr. Wilson receiving the majority of votes cast was duly declared appointed as councilman of the Town of Milwaukie to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Loeding. Mr. Grasle of the Committee appointed to meet with the people of Robertson to make some arrangement for furnishing them with Full Run water, reported that he and the Mayor had met with the people of Robertson and that they were inclined to have Robertson annexed to Milwaukie and become a part of the Town, and that the Committee would recommend that Robertson be annexed to the Town of Milwaukie as this would give the Town authority to extend the water main and furnished the people of the territory so annexed with Full Run water. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Superintendent was instructed to make all connections from the old water systems to the City Water System, according to Sections 3 and 4 of Ordinance No. 139, without charge to the consumer, and that the Treasurer refund all money paid for such connections to the party paying the same.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Treasurer was authorized to pay for all labor performed on the water system under the direction of the Water Supt. as O. K. by said Superintendent, every Saturday night.

A communication from H. M. Esterly, attorney for Montague-O'Reilly Company, in regard to the payment of warrants held by said Company for work on Front Street bridge was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Treasurer was instructed to take up warrants to the amount of \$1000.00 and interest, held by the Montague-O'Reilly Company for work on Front Street bridge. Bills from W. S. Sparks and Mrs. S. M. Hayes for alleged damages for shutting off water was read and upon motion duly made and carried, were laid on the table.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Superintendent was ~~was~~ instructed to turn on the water to those consumers whose water supply has been shut on the account of non-payment of water rent, and to give notice to all consumers by delivering to each a copy of the rules and regulations of the Water Department, before shutting off the water for non-payment of rent. A communication of the Willemette River Sanitary Association asking the Council ~~is~~ to donate the Sum of \$10.00 was read and referred to the health Committee with full authority to act. A petition requesting the Council to make it

unlawful to use firecrackers in the Town of Milwaukie was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to appoint a Committee to investigate the matter. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was authorized to have the necessary notices printed and deliver them to the parties violation Ordinance No. 29. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was given authority to use the Roller outside of the City limits. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee:

Upon motion duly made and carried, the order made at the last Council meeting instructing the Treasurer to take up warrants to the amount of \$1000.00 and interest held by the Montague & O'Reilly Company for work on Front Street bridge, was rescinded. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Treasurer was instructed to pay \$519.93 with interest into the Monroe Street fund in payment of the City share of the cost of the improvement of the same. The recorder was instructed to notify the Minthorn Springs Water Company to repair ~~the~~ its leaking water pipes and main on Harrison, King, 34th & 31st streets at once. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify Mr. U'Ren, the attorney for the Fisch Brothers, that they had not turned over to the Town certain easements and their franchise from Clackamas County in accordance with their stipulation with the Town. Upon motion duly made and carried, J. J. Miller was appointed councilman to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Loeding. Council adjourned.
