TOWN HALL, DECEMBER 11TH, 1923.

The two hundred sixty-first regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, was held on the 11th. day of December, 1923. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred sixtieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 13th day of November, 1923, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 26th day of November, 1923, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the two hundred sixtieth regular meeting held on the 4th day of December, 1923, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was instructed to adjust the water bill against Mr. Cuttler on the basis of fifteen cents per 100 cubic feet. The proposed contract between the City of Portland and the Town of Milwaukie for furnishing bull run water to the Town of Milwaukie was read and upon motion duly made and carried, action was deferred in the matter until the next regular meeting. The Mayor and Recorder were appointed as a committee to interview the City Officials of Portland and see if they would not make a reduction in the Milwaukie water rates. Mr. Hoesly was present and asked the Council if the Town would be able to help gravel the Street through the Hoesly tract. The Council advised Mr. Hoesly that there were no funds on hand that could be used for that purpose.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DEC. 19TH, 1923.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred sixty-first regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. There being no objections to the acceptance of the improvement of 29th. Street, upon motion duly made and carried, the improvement of 29th. Street was accepted. The proposed assessment for the improvement of 29th. Street was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the 7th day of January, 1924, at the hour of 7:00 o'clock P. M. of said day was the time set for hearing and considering objections to said assessment. The objections to the acceptance of the improvement of 23rd Street were read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the matter of accepting the improvement of said street was laid over until the next regular meeting of the Council. The Street Supt. was instructed to gravel the turn table on 23rd Street, and to dump a few loads of gravel in the low places on said street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to preparing an ordinance declaring the assessment for the improvement of 29th. Street, and post the same as required by the City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to establish the grades on 28th. Street and set grade stakes on the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
