TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 3RD. 1921.

The two hundred thirtieth regular meeting of the council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 3rd day of May, 1921. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present Mayor Snyder, councilmen Albee, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the two hundredth twenty-ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the 5th day of April, 1921, and of the special meeting held on the 11th day of April, 1921, also the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the two hundredth twenty-ninth regular meeting held on the 20th day of April, 1921, were read and approved as read. The recorder was instructed to write the P. R/ L & P. Co and ascertain when they were going to install the arc light on Monroe Street. A communication from Florence Olson in regard to renting the lot to the City upon which the Fire Station is located was read and upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the Town pay Florence Olson the sum of \$5.00 per month rental as long as the Fire Station remains on her lot, beginning the 1st day of May, 1921. Upon motion duly made and carried, the proposal of W. H. Counsell for the improvement of 32nd Street for \$2592.00, being the only proposal submitted, was accepted and the contract for the improvement of said street was awarded to W. H. Counsell for said sum of \$2592.00. Mr. Sellwood was present and requested the Council to have the City Engineer prepare specifications for the repair of 30th Street.

A. L. Reed tendered his resignation as Marshal of the Town of Milwaukie, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Resignation of Mr. Reed was accepted. Mayor Snyder appointed J. A. Keck Marshal of the Town of Milwaukie to fill the unexpired term of A. L. Reed.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the appointment of J. A. Keck as Marshal of the Town of Milwaukie was confirmed.

The two hundred thirty-first regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Albee, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Strieb and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred thirtieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 3rd day of May, 1921, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 18th day of May, 1921, were read and approved as read. Mr. Skulason was presented and informed the Council that he had interviewed the Attorneys for the City of Portland in the Telephone Rate re-hearing and that they advised him that they would only look after the interest of the City of Portland. Mr. Skulason stated that the Town should have an attorney to represent it at the rehearing and said that he would represent Milwaukie for a fee of \$200.00.

Mrs. Johnson was presented and stated that she thought the Town should employ an attorney to represent it at the Telephone rehearing and informed the Council if it would appropriate \$100.00 toward the attorney fee that Jennings Lodge and Oak Grove would contribute alike sum. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council employed Mr. Skulason to represent Milwaukie at the Telephone rehearing and appropriated \$100.00 toward his fee. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council donated the use of Mr. Counsell's Truck for Cleanup day.
