A call meeting of the one hundred thirty-third regular meeting of the Town council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present Mayor Elmer, Councilmen, King, Davis, Mitchell, Counsell and Albee and Recorder Mathews. Mr. Morris, the City Engineer was present and informed the Council that the S. P. Company was putting in the over-head crossing on Foster Road according to the plans and specifications. The City Engineer also explained the changes to be made in Front Street, and informed the Council that he would be ready with the plans and specifications and an estimate of the probable cost of the improvement of said street by the next meeting of the Council. A petition of the property owners along Laurel Avenue for the extension of Laurel avenue from Blaine Street West to Railroad Avenue was read, whereupon the following resolution was read and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by Councilman Davis and carried, the said resolution was adopted as read:

RESOLUTION. 6-1913

WHEREAS, the property owners whose property abuts on Laurel Avenue have presented a petition, properly signed, to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie for the extension of Laurel Avenue, from Blaine Street West to Railroad Avenue, said extension to be sixty feet in width, And

WHEREAS, the Council of the Town of Milwaukie deems it expedient and necessary that said extension be made, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, that the City Engineer proceed, and he is hereby instructed to make a survey of the proposed extension of Laurel Avenue, and to make a plat of the same, and a written report containing a full and complete description of said extension, and of the boundaries thereof,

and of the portions of each lot and tract of land to be appropriated therefor.

The report of the Arbitration committee to appraise the value of the Milwaukie Water Company's property was read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried the report was adopted and the Recorder was instructed to post two copies thereof, as required by the Town Charter.
