

MEETING OF MAY 13, 1963

COUNCIL CHAMBER

982nd MEETING

The nine hundred eighty-second regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the thirteenth day of May, 1963.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr. and opened with the invocation by Rev. Harvey Schmitz from the Milwaukie Presbyterian Church.

Present: Mayor Joseph M. Bernard Jr.,; Councilmen Theron Sedgwick, Robert Richmond, Charles Renard and Walter Freeman: City Manager Leonard Mullan, Assistant Manager Max Thompson, City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred eighty-first regular meeting of the Council, held on the eighth day of April, 1963, were approved as written.

The Minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the fifteenth day of April, 1963, were approved as written.

Mr. Rex Buzan came before the Council on the matter of paving 36th Street, north of Harvey St. again stating that the property owners along the street would agree to an assessment for the paving of the street subject to the provision that a load limit be placed on this portion of the street. After some discussion, it was shown that the City would not be justified in limiting the loads on a short strip of street. Manager Mullan reported that when weather conditions would permit, the City's street crew would be repairing streets and this street was on the agenda for repair and patching. It was moved by Freeman and seconded by Richmond that the Council reject the condition of a load limit on this portion of 36th Street. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the annexation of territory described in Ordinance No. 974 and called for objection to the same. There was no citizen present who made objection and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the vacation of the north 350 feet of Bisio Avenue and called for objection to the same. There was no citizen present who made objection and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Mr. Rex Hazen, 3428 Mary Court, made inquiry about the type of dwellings proposed to be built by Charles Renard on a part of Tax Lot 6, Geo. Wills D.L.C. and asked if a building permit had been issued for the same. A copy of a letter to Mr. Renard, from the Milwaukie Planning Commission, was read. The letter contained the following stipulations before the Commission would consider issuing a permit for the dwellings:

- " 1. That your plot plan show, to scale, a minimum of nine paved parking areas with room for maneuvering and proper paved access to the street.
2. That all buildings conform to the Uniform Building Code and that the landscaping conform to the sketch displayed to the Planning Commission.
3. That all buildings be connected to the City Sanitary Sewer.
4. That the main driveway be surfaced with pavement."

Mr. Hazen agreed to hold further questioning pending further action of the Planning Commission.

It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Sedgwick that the Council approve the recommendation and requirements of the Planning Commission. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter, from the Milwaukie Planning Commission, in which they recommended that the zones be changed from 3-R-1 to Commercial Zone on Lot 4, Block 3, Lewelling Park and a part of Block 1, Streib's 1st Addition. Also Tax Lots 45, 47, 50-1, 50, 256, 258, and 52, Lot Whitcomb D.L.C. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that the Council accept the recommendation of the Planning Commission. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mrs. Martha Hauser, 8713 0 40th Street came Before the Council and stated that she had never received a notice of sewer assessment for her property, Lot 9, Block 2, Masonmead, and that recently she had received a notice of penalty added to the assessment and requested that the penalty be excused. It was moved by Freeman and seconded by Renard that this matter be referred to the City Recorder for his report on this matter. Motion carried and so ordered,

Mr. Robert Rogers came before the Council and offered a deed, to the City, for a sixteen foot strip of land along the west side of Where Else Lane, for the purpose of widening Where Else Lane. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Sedgwick that the City accept the deed for a sixteen foot strip of land along the west side of Where Else Lane from Lake Road the Else Where Lane, and that all residences along this road be required to have a twenty-nine foot set-back from the property line. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Sedgwick that the City request the Clackamas County Court to patch and repair Railroad Avenue from 42nd Street to Linwood Avenue, before the City accepts the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Sedgwick that the Planning Commission be requested to require that zone changes be done by permission of the property owners in the area only, until such time that the zoning Ordinance is re-written. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 975 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that Ordinance Number 975 be passed to its second reading and that it be read by title only at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 975 AN ORDINANCE annexing certain territory, contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and fixing the effective date of such annexation, was again taken up and read by title only for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Richmond, Sedgwick, Freeman, Renard and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 975 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 976 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance Number 976 be passed to its second reading and that it be read by title only at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 976 AN ORDINANCE vacating the north 350 feet of Bisio Avenue, a public street within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was again taken up and read for its second reading, by title only, and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Richmond, Sedgwick, Freeman, Renard and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 976 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 977 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that Ordinance No. 977 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 977, AN ORDINANCE providing for the rezoning of certain properties in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, from Zone 3-R-1 to Commercial Zone, amending Ordinance No. 481, as amended, and declaring an emergency, was again taken up and read for its second reading, by title only and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Richmond, Sedgwick, Freeman, Renard and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 977 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that the following Resolution be adopted.

It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that the City Manager be authorized to dispose of the International pick-up truck and the 1934 Ford truck chassis. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan reported that children in the neighborhood of the Fontana house (demolished by fire) had found jugs of wine in the cellar of the house. It was moved by Renard and seconded by Sedgwick that the wine be reported to the Oregon Liquor Control Commission and request that they remove this nuisance, and that the City Attorney take the necessary steps to have the remains of the house and two old automobiles on the Leo Fontana property, declared a public nuisance and to ascertain what steps the City must take to eliminate the same.. Motion carried and so ordered.

The question of a stopped up drain pipe, carrying spring water from Lot 3, Karlen's Addition (Zenas Olson property) was reported by Manager Mullan. It was moved by Freeman and seconded by Sedgwick that the City Manager ascertain and make certain that the stoppage in the drain pipe is not on City Property. (in City Street) Motion carried and so ordered.

The Police Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.
 The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Manager Mullan read a letter from Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co. in which they accept the terms of Ordinance No. 963. (Telephone booths on streets)

It was moved by Renard and seconded by Sedgwick that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 13-1963

A resolution declaring the intention of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, to construct SANITARY SEWERS along 26th Street from Gino Lane southerly to a point in the division line between Tax Lots 291 and 106-1, Whitcomb D.L.C., 28th Street from Lot 3, Block 2, Hoesly's Lakeside Addition to its southerly terminus and along Lakeside Avenue from 28th Street to its westerly terminus, AND TO CONSTRUCT A LIFT STATION to pump sewage from these sanitary sewers to the trunk line sewer in Lake Road.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to construct sanitary sewers along 26th Street from Gino Lane southerly to a point in the dividing line between Tax Lots 291 and 106-1, Whitcomb D.L.C.: along 28th Street from Lot 3, Block 2, Hoesly's Lakeside Addition and along Lakeside Avenue from 28th Street to its westerly terminus ALSO to construct a sewage lift station and pressure to carry sewage from these

sanitary sewers to the trunk line sewer in Lake Road. and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, has required from the City Engineer, plans and specifications for approximate improvement to accomplish the above and an estimate of the cost of the work to be done, and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has heretofore filed such plans and specifications and estimates in the office of the City Recorder,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the above mentioned plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer now on file with the City Recorder are found to be satisfactory and are hereby approved.

BE FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon does hereby declare its intention and purpose to make such improvement, and the location and kind of improvement being as follows:

By the construction of sanitary sewers, and all things necessary in the construction thereof, all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file in the office of the City Recorder, which plans and specifications hereby are referred to and made a part of this Resolution.

By the construction of a SEWAGE LIFT STATION, and all things necessary in the construction thereof, all to be done in accordance with plans and specifications now on file with the City Recorder, which plans and specifications hereby are referred to and made a part of this resolution.

By the construction of a sewage pressure line and all things necessary in the construction thereof, all to be done in accordance with plans and specifications now on file with the City Recorder and which plans and specifications hereby are referred to and made a part of the Resolution.

Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan reported the Engineer's estimate for the cost of improving Adams Street in Duersts Addition.

It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 14-1963

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, TO IMPROVE BALFOUR STREET, BY CURBS AND BLACKTOP PAVING OR BY CURBS ONLY, FROM 32nd STREET TO ITS WEST TERMINI.

WHEREAS, The Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve Balfour Street from its intersection with 32nd Street, to its westerly terminus, by curbs and black-top surfacing or by curbs only, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, has required from the City Engineer, plans and specifications for approximate improvement to accomplish the above, and an estimate of the cost of the work to be done, and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has heretofore filed such plans, specifications and estimates in the office of the City Recorder,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the above mentioned plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer, now on file with the City Recorder are found to be satisfactory and are hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, does hereby declare its intention and purpose to make such improvement, the location and kind of improvement being as follows:

By the construction of curbs along both sides of Balfour Street from its intersection with 32nd Street to its westerly terminus and/or by grading and paving with black-top paving the same street from 32nd Street to its westerly terminus.

Motion carried and so ordered.

Assistant Manager Thompson outlined to the Council the cost of operation of the Sewage Treatment Plant and suggested that the users maintenance charge be increased. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Sedgwick that an ordinance be drawn, providing for the adoption of a new schedule for the Sewer User Disposal Plant Maintenance charge. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Matter of charges made by the City for liquor permit recommendation in cases where the Oregon Liquor Commission does not issue the permit, was discussed. It was moved by Renard and seconded by Richmond that the moneys paid by Mrs. Aebi for liquor permits recommended by not issued, be refunded to her. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Renard that the following bills be approved and that warrants be drawn for the payment of same.
