A communication from Gibbs & Sheppard asking permission to pile wood on the west side of Front Street near Harrison Street was read and referred to the Street Committee with authority to act. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JUNE 13TH. 1916.

The one hundred and seventy-first (171) regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, councilmen, Hopkins, Grasle, Harlow and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the one hundred and seventieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 9th day of May, 1916, and the minutes of the special meetings of the Council held on the 18th and 24th days of May, 1916, and on the 1st day of June, 1916, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to notify Giebisch & Joplin that the Council would give them permission to use the Columbia Hydrants and the National Tube Company gates & valves in place of the hydrants and gates and valves provided for in the plans and specifications, in order that the water system may be completed without further delay. Upon motion duly made and carried, the matter of making the connections between the main on 29th Street and the pumping station, and between the 6 inch main on Monroe Street and the 4 inch main on Milwaukie Highway was left to the discretion of the Engineer and Water Superintendent. Upon motion of councilman Harlow seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into ~~ax~~ a contract, on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, with the Lakewood Water Users Association, upon the terms agreed upon, and after the approval of said contract by the Mayor and Recorder. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Superintendent was instructed to connect the stand-pipe in the School House with the main on Main Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to establish the grade on 29th Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the following ordinances were read and a copy of each ordered posted as required by the City Charter: Ordinance No. 141 entitled, "An ordinance establishing the grades on 32nd Street from the southwesterly line of Elmer Street to the North line of Wister Street"; Ordinance No. 142 entitled, "An ordinance establishing the grades on 40th Street from the center line of King Street to the north line of Monroe Street"; Ordinance No. 143 entitled, "An ordinance establishing the grades on 31st Street from the southwesterly line of Elmer Street to the south line of Elmer Sellwood Street"; Ordinance No. 144 entitled, "An ordinance establishing the grades on 27th Street from the South line of Washington Street to the end, 1000 ft. distant southerly from the said Washington", and Ordinance No. 145 entitled, "An Ordinance establishing the grades on 29th Street from the South line of Monroe Street to the north line of Washington Street".

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify Montague-O'Rielly Company to repair the hard surface pavement on Front Street. Upon motion of councilman Grasle seconded by councilman Hopkins and carried, the action of the council in a Committee of the whole in exonerating the Marshal from the charges preferred against him and restoring his salary was sustained and adopted. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee, and upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

A special meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, councilmen, Grasle, Harlow, Counsell and Hopkins, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The Mayor stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering the changing of the water rates within the Town of Milwaukie.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the water rates within the Town of Milwaukie were reduced from 30 cents per 100 cu. ft. to 15 cents per 100 cu. ft. for all water consumed over and above the minimum of 300 cubic feet. said rates to be effective from the 1st day of June, 1916. Mr. Judge informed the Council that the people west the the city limits who were formerly supplied with water by the Milwaukie Water Co. would pay the minimum rate of \$2.00 per month and for all water used over the minimum ~~at~~ would pay the rate established by the Town of Milwaukie and would buy their own meters and pay for the installation of the same, but would not at this time turn over their water pipes to the Town of Milwaukie. Upon motion duly made and carried, the proposition of Mr. Judge was accepted. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mayor Pelton and Mr. Grasle were appointed as a special Committee to meet with the people of Robertson and see what arrangements could be made for furnishing the people of Robertson ~~with~~ with Bull Run water. The bill of Mr. E. Hefty for \$13.10 for material furnished and labor performed on the Roller was read and referred to the Finance Committee, which Committee allowed \$8.10 of said bill, and upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw a warrant for ~~that amount~~ \$8.10 in payment of the same. Councilman Hopkins handed in his resignation as councilman from the 2nd. ward, which resignation was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the resignation of Mr. Hopkins was accepted. Nominations for councilman to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Councilman Hopkins was declared in order. Upon motion duly made and carried, Leo Shindler was placed in nomination. ~~That being the only nomination~~ ~~the nomination of Leo Shindler was declared~~ and duly appointed by the Council to fill the unexpired term of councilman Hopkins as councilman in Ward #2 of Milwaukie, Oregon. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
