

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, DEC. 18TH. 1914.

An adjourned meeting of the one hundred fifty-third regular meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Mitchell, King, Loeding, Albee and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The proposed assessment for the improvement of Laurel Avenue was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the 2nd day of January, 1915, was the time set for hearing objections if any there be, to the proposed assessment. The plans and specifications for the installation of the water system for Milwaukie was taken up for consideration, and the same being satisfactory to the Council, upon motion duly made and carried, the said plans and specifications were adopted. A resolution authorizing the Town of Milwaukie to enter into a contract with the City of Portland for supplying the Town of Milwaukie with Pull Run water was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the resolution was adopted as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the installation of a water system for Milwaukie, said bids to be opened the 28th day of December, 1914.. The recorder was instructed to make application to the County Court of Clackamas County for a franchise to lay water mains on the County Road between the City limits of Portland and the City limits of Milwaukie.

An adjourned meeting of the regular one hundred fifty third meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen Mitchell, King, Albee, Counsell and Loeding, and Marshal Reed. The Recorder being absent, the Mayor appointed W. A. Hanson Recorder pro. tem. A communication from the Portland Gas & Coke Company was read and ordered placed on file. The statement of the Treasurer as to the amount of money paid the Contractors for the improvement of Foster Road was read, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the maintenance fund due the Rockolite Contracting Co for two years was ordered paid. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the bid of Giebisch & Joplin for \$16,469. for the construction of a water system for Milwaukie was accepted, and the contract awarded said firm subject to the decision of the Court. Upon motion duly made and carried, the

Treasurer was instructed to return the check accompanying the several bids, excepting the check of Giebisch & Joplin.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the Law Firm of Clark, Skulason & Clark was employed to defend the City in the injunction suit now pending. Upon motion duly made and carried the council adjourned until the 2nd day of January, 1915.

A special meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date. Meeting Called to Order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, councilmen Grasle, Bond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. Mayor Pelton appointed the following Committees:

Fire Committee, Counsell and Bond.
Finance Committee, Skulason, Peery and Grasle.
Light " " , Peery, Grasle and Counsell.
License " , Skulason, Bond and Counsell.
Street " , Grasle, Skulason and Peery.

The mayor appointed Samuel Riley night watchman, and upon the motion of councilman Skulason seconded by councilman Grasle and carried, the appointment of Mr. Riley was confirmed.

The matter of the proposed assessment for the improvement of Laurel Avenue was taken up, and the remonstrance of the Oregon and California Railroad Company to the amount of the assessment apportioned to their property was read and referred to the Street Committee for investigation..

The petitions of F. J. Roysen and S. U. Germanetti for liquor licenses for the year 1915, were read and referred to the License Committee.

The Committee recommended that S. U. Germanetti be granted a license as petitioned for, and a majority report recommended that F. J. Roysen also be granted a liquor license, a minority report of Committee recommended that F. J. Roysen be not granted a liquor license. Moved by Councilman Bond and seconded by councilman Counsell, that the majority report of the License Committee be adopted and that F. J. Roysen be granted a liquor license. Motion carried. Ayes: Bond, Peery and Counsell. Nays, Grasle and Skulason. Upon motion of councilman Skulason seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the report of the License committee upon granting S. U. Germanetti a liquor license was adopted and the license granted for the year 1915. Ayes, Skulason, Grasle, Bond, Peery and Counsell. Nays, none.

The recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Co. not to move any of the Arc lights until further notice from the Council.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
