TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUGUST 12TH, 1924.

The two hundred sixty-ninth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 12th. day of August, 1924.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Johnson, Kerr, McIntyre and Kleeb. Recorder Mathews and Marshall Keck. The minutes of the two hundred sixty-eight regular meeting of the Council held on the 8th. day of July, 1924, were read and approved as read. The following resolution was read and unanimously adopted as read:

RESOLUTION. 7-19-24

WHEREAS, on the 17th day of May, 1924, at a meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, regularly called and held, a resolution was unanimously adopted, reciting that the said Council deemed it necessary and expedient and for the best interests of said Town of Milwaukie to acquire jurisdiction over a certain portion of a County Road lying within the corporate limits of said Town, and described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pipe on the true west line of Front Street in said Town of Milwaukie, County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, according to the official plat of the Town of Milwaukie on file in the office of the Recorder of Conveyances of Clackamas County, Oregon, 71.50 feet north 10 degrees west from the intersection of the center line of Jefferson Street and the true west line of said Front Street; thence south 89 degrees west 332.55 feet to an iron spike on the east meander line of the Willamette River; thence south 10 degrees east 60.75 feet following the meander upstream of said Willamette River; thence north 89 degrees east 332.55 feet to a point on said true west line of Front Street; thence north 10 degrees west 60.75 feet along the said true west line of Front Street to the place of beginning.

AND WHEREAS, the said Town by said resolution requested the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon, and the County Court thereof to surrender to said Town jurisdiction over the above described portion of said County Road;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to said resolution, a petition was filed by said Town, addressed to the said County Court, embodying the said resolution, and the foregoing request;

AND WHEREAS, thereafter such proceedings were had in said County Court, that on the 6th. day of August, 1924, said County Court made and entered an order in compliance with the prayer of said petition, offering to surrender to said Town jurisdiction over said above described portion of said County Road; provided that such offer should be accepted by said Town by appropriate resolution or ordinance within thirty days from date of said order:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, that the offer of the County of Clackamas to surrender jurisdiction over said portion of said County Road as set forth in said order be and the same is hereby accepted, and that said Town of Milwaukie henceforth assumes jurisdiction over said portion of said County Road, for its improvement, construction and repair, and for the levying and collection of assessments therefor, and for the control therefor and over the same to the same extent and in like manner as it has jurisdiction of and controls the public streets and alleys of said Town by virtue of the provisions of its charter and the laws of the State of Oregon.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the acceptance of said offer be communicated to said County of Clackamas and to the County Court thereof in compliance with the provisions of said order by filing in the office of the County Clerk of said County a certified copy of this resolution.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to survey that portion of a county road between Front Street and the Willamette River taken over by the Town and place iron pipes at each corner and to set grade stakes for the construction of cement sidewalks in front of the property of the Episcopal Church. The report of the State Health Board on the analysis of the water from the City wells showed the water unfit for domestic use.

The Report of the City Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. The application of C. C. Mullan for an increase of salary from \$25.00 per month to \$75.00 per month was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the salary of C. C. Mullan was raised from \$25.00 per month to \$75.00 per month. Upon motion duly made and carried, H. W. Oliver was granted fifteen days addition time within which to complete the improvement of Harvey Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the Harvey Street fund in the amount of \$1000.00 in favor of Mr. Oliver in part payment of the improvement of Harvey Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 214 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, Kleeb and McIntyre. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 214 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 214 was laid on the table until the next regular meeting.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, SEPT 9TH. 1924.

The two hundred seventieth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 9th. day of September, 1924. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred sixty-ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the 12th day of August, 1924, was read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Riley was instructed to purchase sufficient hot stuff and patch all the paved streets in Milwaukie. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 214 was taken up for the second reading. The ordinance being read, councilman Miller objected to the passage of the ordinance in its present form.

Moved by councilmen Miller and seconded by councilman McIntyre that ordinance No. 214 be amended that the Southern Pacific Company in replacing the fill across Kellogg Lake will replace the same with a steel structure or other modern structure satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie. Motion carried. The Recorder was instructed to redraft ordinance No. 214 as amended and post the same as required by the City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Riley was instructed to notify the property owners to clean the sidewalks in front of their property as required by City ordinances.
