TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, NOV. 4TH. 1919...

The two hundred twelfth (212) regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 4th day of November, 1919. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen
Miller, Grasle, Albee, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer
Streib and Marshal Read. The minutes of the two hundred eleven (211)
meeting of the Council held on the 7th day of October, 1919, and the minutes of
special meeting of the Council held on the 11th day of October, 1919, were read and approved as read. Cpuncilman Hart reported that he had ordered one dozen cement meter boxes and that half of them were in Portland and the other half on the way to Portland. Councilmen Counsell reported that he had put in the conduit across Harrison Street and the City wall and also one at, Shindler's corner and one at Skulason's place. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Committee were instructed to run the drain in the gutter on the north side and of Harrison Street to 28th Street and from there to run the drain in the Creek on Mr. Miller Place.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Committee was instructed to comply with the request of the S. P. Co. in constructing the Town's part of the drain from the S. P. Co. railroad crossing. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Committee instructed was instructed to make the necessary repairs on Harrison and Washington Streets. Mr. Albee was authorized to interviewithe property owners along Railroad Ave. and see if they would have the Street improved. The petition from the County Court of Clackamas County requesting that alspecial (Road) meeting be realled to levy an assessment for road purposes was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the petition was ordered returned to the County Court with a notation thereon that the Town of Milwaukie did not need roads.

A petition of the property owners along 32nd Street requesting that

said street be improved was read and ordered returned to the petitioners with instructions that the petition did not comply with the Charter.

Upon motion duly made and carried, a tax of \$6076.60 was levied against thetaxable property within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the year 1920. The matter of the purchase of an Auto for the Fire Department was left to the Committee to be appointed by the Mayor to inves tigate the matter and report to the Council.

Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews amd Marshall Read. The Mayor stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of appointing a Municipal Roxing Commissioner; toptake the place of Mr. Cooper who intended to resign. Mr. Cooper was present and resigned as Boxing Commissioner, which resignation was accepted by the Council. The mayor appointed Leo Shindler to fill the wacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Cooper, and Dr. Lowe to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Dr. Houser. Upon motion duly made and carried, the appointment of Leo Shindler and Dr. Lowe as members of the Municipal Roxing Commission (of Milwaukie was duly confirmed. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was authorized to appoint 6 good men as Deputy Marshals to be on duty from 7 o'clock P. M. Tuesday might the 25th day of November, 1919; until the boxing contests are over and the crowd dispersed, and that they be paid the sum of \$5.00 each for their services. Upon motion duly made, and, carried, the council adjourned.
